To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, Bailiffs, and Common Council of the Town of Liverpool, in Council affembled.

May it pleafe your Majefly,

WE. your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, Bailiffs, and Common Council of the Town of Liverpool, in Council alfembled, beg Leave to approach the Throne with the molt heartfelt Congratulations on those late Events on the Continent of Europe, which feem to promife the Dawn of a brighter Day to the Liberties and the Independence of Nations.

Your Majetty's paternal Care, through a long and glorious Reign, has often called from us refpectful Expressions of Gratitude and Attachment; and we cannot avoid on this Occafion entreating your Ma-jefty to accept our most unfeigned Thanks for the recent Inflance of your Solicitude, not only for the Safety of your People, but for the Honour of the British Name, by evincing to Europe and to the World the Generosity of a great and powerful Nation in the Affiltance she disinterestedly affords to those who struggle against Oppression, Persidy, and Fraud for that Liberty, which, under Providence, fhe has herfelf fo long enjoyed.

We beg Leave to assure your Majesty of our unalterable Attachment to your Majelly's facred Perfon; of our Confidence in the Wildom, Vigour, and patriotic Measures of your Majesty's Govern-ment; and of our firm Resolution to support your Majefty by every Exertion, and through every Sacrifice.

We devoutly pray, that your Majefty may long live to witnefs the Bleffings beftowed by your beneficent Reign upon a free and happy People; and that the bright Example of your Majefty's public and private Life may long remain an emphatic Call on Britons to cultivate thole Virtues, through which true Freedom, by continuing to be deferved, has its best Hope of Perpetuity.
