## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the last Sef-V fion of Parliament, intituled "An Act to permit Goods fecured in Warehoules in the Port " of London to be removed to the Out Ports for "Exportation to any Part of Europe; for em-"powering His Majelty to direct that Licences, "which His Majelty is authorized to grant under " " His Sign Manual, may be granted by one of the " Principal Secretaries of State; and for enabling " His Majelly to permit the Exportation of Goods in Veflels of lefs Burthen than are now allowed " by Law during the prefent Hostilities, and until " One Month after the Signature of the preliminary "Articles of Peace ;" it is enacted, that it fhall and may be lawful for His Majefty by Order in Council, or by His Royal Proclamation, to direct that all or any fuch Licences as, by virtue of any Act of Parliament or otherwife, His Majefty may lawfully grant under His Sign Manual, fhall and may be granted by one of His Majelty's Principal Scoretarics of State, in purluance of an Order of Council specially authorizing the Grant of such Licences, a Duplicate of which Order shall in all Cafes be annexed to fuch Licences; His Majefty having taken the fame into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, and it is hereby ordered and directed, that all Licences which by virtue of any Acts of Parliament or otherwife His Majefty may lawfully grant under His Sign Manual touching, concerning, or in any Manner relating to Trade, Commerce, or Navigation, shall and may hereafter, and until further Order, be granted by either of His Majelly's Principal Secretaries of State, in purfuance of any Order in Council fpecially authorizing the Grant of fuch Licences; and that all Licences fo granted, and having a Duplicate of fuch Order in Council annexed thereto, shall be as valid, and have as full Force and Effect, as if such Licences had been granted under His Majefty's Sign Manual; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or taken to invalidate, or in any Manner to deemed or taken to invalidate, or in any Manner to We beg to affure your Majefty, that to a Caufe affect any Licences which His Majefty fhall think fo worthy of your Feelings, and fo congenial to

## To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty.

WE, the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty of the W L, the Mayor, Ballins, and Commonarty of the City of Winchelter, prefume to approach the Throne of your Majelty with our humble but un-feigned Exprefitons of Duty and Affection; and we beg Leave molt fincerely to congratulate your Majefty on the happy Refloration of Peace between this Country and the Spanish Nation. Your Majefty, viewing the noble and unexampled Exertions of a great Nation for the Maintenance

Exertions of a great Nation for the Maintenance of their Laws, their Liberties, and their Religion, against the daring and unprincipled Claims and Attempts of an Ulurper, has felt that Spirit of true Magnanimity and Patriotilm by which every Pate of your Majelty's Reign has been eminently diftin-guished; and the Promptitude and Decision of the Measures adopted by your Majefty effectually to affilt and co operate with the Spanish and Portu-guele Patriots, has exhibited to the World a fresh Proof of your uncealing Solicitude for the Welfare and Deliverance of Europe, and your Anxiety to gratify the ardent and unanimous Feelings of your loyal Subjects. We observe the Events which are palling in Spain and Portugal with the most lively Anxiety, and with the deepeit Interest; not as af-fecting alone the Emancipation of those Countries from the Yoke of France, but as exhibiting a bright Example of Firmnefs and Unanimity calculated to animate the Nations of Europe to an effectual Re-fiftance against that defolating and degrading Asm of lawless Power by which they have been to long vifited and difgraced.
