MEMORANDUM.

Horfe Guards, September 3, 1808. HE following Address having been transmit-ted to the Right Honourable Lord Hawkesbury, His Majefty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by his Lordship presented to the King; which Address His Majetty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly:

To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefly.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, the Freeholders of the County of Kilkenny, defire to express our grateful and unreferved Acknowledgment and Thanks for your Majefty's dignified Determination to affift with the powerful Support of this United Kingdom the virtuous and manly Exertions of the Spanish People to preferve l

their national Independence from lawlefs and unprin-cipled Aggreffion. Feeling, as we do, that the Independence of your Majefty's Crown, and the Security of our conftitutional Privileges, are Bleffings above all Price, and for which there can be no Compenfation, we view with fympathetic Regard a gallant People engaged with energetic Unanimity in De-fence of their deareft Rights. This is a legitimate Caufe of War, which ennobles the Valour that it roufes into Action. We hail with Joy the brilliant Commencement of this dignified Contest, and trust that the glorious Refult will prove to an admiring World how completely a spirited People, although unuled to Arms, when rifing with Unanimity in Defence of their Independence, their Altars, and their Throne, can triumph over every Exertion of the most widely extended, and the most completely organized Military Despotism, to effect their Sub-

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces.

War-Office, August 25, 1808.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the King, that there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different Regular Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Inftance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; His Majefty has been gracioully pleafed to grant His Free Pardon to all De-ferters from His Regular Land Forces, who shall furrender themfelves on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of October, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whole Stations

are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Commandant of the Army Depôt in the Ifle of Wight.

Such Deferters, it Able bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be feat to the Regiments from which they refpectively deferted, or be appointed to fuch Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majefty may be pleafed to command; and when 19 placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other Regular Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majelty is gracioully

pleafed to extend to fuch Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon ; and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themfelves to their respective Commanding Officers on or before the Twenty-fourth of October next, and they shall not be liable at any future Time to be claimed by the' Regiments in which they formerly ferved.

The Magistrate to whom any Deferter from His Majefty's Regular Forces may furrender himfelf, is

authorized and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered himfelf; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the neareft Military Poft, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unlefs prevented by Sicknefs, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magiftrate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at fuch Military Poft.

And, with a View to prevent as far as possible all Soldiers from Defertion after these His Majefty's most gracious Intentions shall be made known, His Majeffy has been pleafed to command, that the Name of every Soldier who may hereafter defert shall be transmitted, through the Secretary at War, to the Church Wardens of the Parishes to which the Deferters belong, in order that their Names may be exposed to public View in the Church, or fuch other confpicuous Place as may render it impoffible for Men, who have been guilty of this Crime, to return Home to their Friends, on whom they have brought Difgrace by their Milconduct, without immediate Detection; and His Majelty has further commanded that this Measure shall be made public, that every Soldier may be affured that the greateft Exertions will be used for the Apprehen-fion of any Man who may hereafter defert, and that those who have already been guilty of that Crime may be aware of the daily Rick they incur of Detection, and of the most fevere Punishment, if they do not immediately avail themfelves of the Pardon held out in this His Majefty's molt gracious Proclamation.


Any Soldier who may defert after these His Majefly's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

It is to be clearly underflood, that this Proclamation of Pardon is intended to include all Deferters . from the Army of Referve and Additional Force Act, but not to extend to any Deferter from His Majefty's Militia Forces.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY. W HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Forty-
