P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was, pleased by His Orders in Council, of the Sixth of January and Fourth of May last, to direct certain Measures to be taken for the Care and Custody of Portuguese Property belonging to Persons residing in Portugal or elsewhere, under the Controul of France, which had been detained by British Cruizers, and to subject such Property to the future Disposition of the Prince Regent of Portugal, in Consideration of the Owners not being entitled to the Possession of it while they remained under the Controul of the Enemy:

And whereas the Deliverance of Portugal from such Controul has since been effected, and the Inhabitants of that Country are again become duly qualified to receive the Restitution of their Property:

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Portuguese Property shall be forthwith restored to the respective Owners thereof, or their lawful Agents; and the Persons appointed by virtue of the Order in Council of the 6th of January last, for the Care and Management of the Portuguese Property, are hereby ordered to restore the same accordingly; such Property nevertheless being subject to the Payment of the legal Charges thereon, and of the Expenses justly incurred in respect thereto; and all Questions regarding the Ownership of such Property, where any Doubt shall be entertained by the Persons aforesaid, with respect to the same, and the Charges and Expenses thereon, shall be decided upon summarily by the High Court of Admiralty, or the Court of Vice-Admiralty, in which such Property may have been brought to Adjudication.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Courts of Vice Admiralty are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act, made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act, made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be, and the same is thereby further continued until the Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the Twenty-third Day of March last, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act, to allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twenty-fifth Day of the said Month of March, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, on the Terms specified in the said Order; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from

the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant September, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and His Majesty doth hereby order, that, on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, with any of the Articles above-mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Collingwood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to the Honourable W. W. Pole, dated on board the Ocean, at Gibraltar, August 27, 1808.

SIR,

I INCLOSE, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter I have received from Lord Cochrane, Captain of His Majesty's Ship the Imperieuse, giving an Account of the Surrender of the Castle of Mongal (a Fort on the Coast of Catalonia, in Possession of the French), to His Majesty's Ship under his Command, which his Lordship had subsequently destroyed, after having delivered the principal Part of the Military Stores to the Spanish Militia.

I have great Pleasure in transmitting this Information to their Lordships, as it points out one of the many Instances in which His Majesty's Ships on the Eastern Coast of Spain have rendered effectual Aid to the Patriot Spaniards, in resisting and driving the Enemy out of their Country, and of the Zeal and indefatigable Industry with which Captain Lord Cochrane engages in that Service.

Captain Otway, of the Montague, landed at Rosas Bay a Party of Marines in Aid of the Spanish Peasantry, to oppose a French Force which was approaching to attack that Fortrefs on the 23d Ult. and obliged the Enemy to retire.

His Majesty's Ship Imperieuse, off Mongal,

MY LORD,

31st July 1808.

THE Castle of Mongal, an important Post, completely commanding a Pass in the Road from Barcelona to Gerona, which the French are now besieging, and the only one between those Towns occupied by the Enemy, surrendered this Morning to His Majesty's Ship under my Command. The Spanish Militia behaved admirably, in carrying an Out Post on a neighbouring Hill. Lieutenant Hone, with the Marines, took Possession of the Castle, which, by Means of Powder, is now levelled with the Ground. The Rocks there are blown down into the Road, which in many other Places is rendered impassable to Artillery without a very heavy Loss of Men, if they determine to repair them.

I inclose to your Lordship a List of the Prisoners and of the material Part of Military Stores; all that could be of Use to the Spanish Militia have been delivered to them.

SIR,

I HAVE great Pleasure in inclosing, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter from Captain Beaver, of His Majesty's Ship Acasta, acquainting me with the Capture of a very fine French Corvette, of Sixteen Twenty-four Pounder Carronades and Two long Sixes. It is my Intention to take her into the Service, and name her the Pert, until their Lordship's Pleasure is known.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deserters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces.

War-Office, August 25, 1808.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the King, that there are at this Time several Deserters from the different Regular Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majesty's gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; His Majesty has been graciously pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deserters from His Regular Land Forces, who shall surrender themselves on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of October, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Commandant of the Army Carlisle. Such Deserters, if Able-bodied

Men, and fit for Service, shall be sent to the Regiments from which they respectively deserted, or be appointed to such Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majesty may be pleased to command; and when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the said Deserters may have enlisted in other Regular Corps, and are now serving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deserters the Benefit of this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to serve in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers on or before the Twenty-fourth of October next, and they shall not be liable at any future Time to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly served.

The Magistrate to whom any Deserter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may surrender himself, is authorized and required to certify the Day on which such Deserter surrendered himself; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deserter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by some Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwise proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at such Military Post.

And, with a View to prevent as far as possible all Soldiers from Desertion after these His Majesty's most gracious Intentions shall be made known, His Majesty has been pleased to command, that the Name of every Soldier who may hereafter desert shall be transmitted, through the Secretary at War, to the Church Wardens of the Parishes to which the Deserters belong, in order that their Names may be exposed to public View in the Church, or such other conspicuous Place as may render it impossible for Men, who have been guilty of this Crime, to return Home to their Friends, on whom they have brought Disgrace by their Misconduct, without immediate Detection; and His Majesty has further commanded that this Measure shall be made public, that every Soldier may be assured that the greatest Exertions will be used for the Apprehension of any Man who may hereafter desert, and that those who have already been guilty of that Crime may be aware of the daily Risk they incur of Detection, and of the most severe Punishment, if they do not immediately avail themselves of the Pardon held out in this His Majesty's most gracious Proclamation.

Any Soldier who may desert after these His Majesty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

It is to be clearly understood, that this Proclamation of Pardon is intended to include all Deserters from the Army of Reserve and Additional Force Act, but not to extend to any Deserter from His Majesty's Militia Forces.

NEW STAMP DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, September 26, 1808.

Notice is hereby given, that by an Act, passed at the Close of the late Session of Parliament, the Stamp Duties on Deeds, Law Proceedings, and other written Instruments, and the Duties on Legacies and Successions to personal Estate upon Intestacies, now payable in Great Britain, are repealed from and after the 10th Day of October next, and other Duties are granted in lieu thereof, to commence immediately after that Day.

The new Duties are of the like Nature, and in general of the same Amount, with the present Duties; but a more precise and accurate Description is given of the Instruments on which they attach. There are some Duties altogether new, and some new in Amount; of which the principal ones are, *ad valorem* Duties on Conveyances upon the Sale of any Property, according to the Amount of the Purchase-Money; increased Duties on Promissory Notes allowed to be re-issued; and a Duty on Licences to be taken out Yearly by Bankers and others issuing such Promissory Notes. There is also a Duty on Policies of Insurance on Lives, and on Three or Four Law Proceedings, not now charged. The Duties on Mortgages for small Sums, and on Conveyances on the Sale of Property of small Value, are less than at present. The Duties are contained in a Schedule, in which the Instruments charged are classed and alphabetically arranged, with numerous References, so as to afford a complete Table of Duties in the most convenient and practical Form, and to supersede the Necessity of those Compilations to which the Profession of the Law and the Public have hitherto found it expedient to resort. The Schedule is also framed so as not to admit of an Abridgment that can be safely relied upon. The Commissioners therefore recommend it to the Profession, and others whom it may concern, to look only to the Schedule itself.

The Act contains special Provisions for securing the Duties on Conveyances on the Sale of Property, on Bills of Exchange, and Drafts on Bankers post-dated, or issued beyond Ten Miles from the Bankers' Residence, and on Instruments relating to Copyhold Estates, which the Commissioners recommend to the Notice and Attention of Purchasers and Sellers, Attornies, Solicitors, Bankers, Stewards of Manors, and others, that they may not incur Penalties, which it will be the Duty of the Commissioners to enforce. The Provisions respecting Drafts on Bankers take effect after One Month from the passing of the Act.

LEGACY DUTY.

It being apprehended that many Persons may have neglected to pay the Duties on Legacies, and on Residues of personal Estate given by Will, or devolved to next of Kin upon Intestacies, within the Time prescribed by Law, through Ignorance or Inadvertence, or from accidental or unavoidable Causes; the Act authorises the Commissioners to remit the Penalties which may have been incurred in such Cases, provided the Duty shall be paid on or before the 31st Day of January 1809. In giving Notice of this Provision of the

Act, the Commissioners think it right also to state, that Prosecutions in the Exchequer will be instituted against those Persons who shall not take the Benefit of it, as well as against those who shall fail to pay the Duties which may hereafter become due, within the Time allowed by Law; an Abstract of Wills proved and Administrations granted being returned to the Commissioners from the several Ecclesiastical Courts, for the Purpose of discovering Defaulters.
