The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His VV Orders in Council, of the Sixth of January and Fourth of May lalt, to direct certain Measures to be taken for the Care and Cuftody of Portuguele Property belonging to Persons residing in Portugal or estewhere, under the Control of France, which had been detained by British Cruizers, and to subject fuch Property to the future Disposition of the Prince Regent of Portugal, in Confideration of the Owners not being entitled to the Possession of it while they remained under the Control of the Enemy:

And whereas the Deliverance of Portugal from fuch Controll has since been effected, and the Inhahisants of that Country are again become duly qualified to receive the Rellitution of their Property;

His Majelly is therefore pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is thereby ordered, that all Portuguese Property shall the forthwith rellored to the respective Owners thereof, or their lawful Agents; and the Persons appointed by virtue of the Order in Council of the . 6th of January Jaky for the Care and Munagement, of the Portuguele Propenty are hereby ordered to restore the same accordingly; such Property never theless being subject to the Payment of the legal Charges thereon, and of the Expences justife incurred in respect thereto; and all Questions regarding the Ownership of such Property, where any Doubt shall be entertained by the Persons afterestid, with respect to the same, and the Charges and Bx-pences thereon, shall be decided upon summarily by the High Court of Admiralty, or the Gourt of · Vice-Admitalty, in which fuch Property may have been brought to Adjudication.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treatury: His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Courts of Vice. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Sef-VV fion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an AQ, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An AQ for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act, made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act. made in the Forty-leventh Year of His present Majefty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be, and the same is thereby further continued until the Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty:of Peace: And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the Twentythird Day of March last, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Ast, to allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twenty-fifth Day of the said Month of March, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, on the Terms specified in the said Order: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, cslary. Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from

the Twenty-fifth Day of this inflant September, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and His Majesty doth hereby order, that, on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Pavment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel .-And the Right Honourable the Lords Commis-fioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces.

War-Office, August 25, 1808. WHEREAS it has been represented to the King, that there are at this Time feveral Deserters from the different Regular Corps in His. Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's

gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of His held out in this His Majesty's most gracious Protheir future Behaviour; His Majesty has been gra-ciously pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all De-serters from His Regular Land Forces, who shall · furrender themfelves on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of October, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations

are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Commandant of the Army Depot in the Isle of Wight.

Such Deferters, if Able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be sent to the Regiments from which they respectively deserted, or be appointed to Such Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majesty may be pleased to command; and when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they

may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlitted in other London. Regular Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to specific Descripts the Benefit of

this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to ferre in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers on or before the Twenty-fourth of October next, and they shall not be liable at any future Time to be claimed by the Regiments in which they for-merly ferved.

The Magistrate to whom any Deserter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may surrender himself, is authorized and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter surrendered himself; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military. Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by some Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwise proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer-commanding at fuch Military Post.

And, with a View to prevent as far as possible all Soldiers from Defertion after these His Majely's nioft gracious Intentions thall be made known, His Majelty has been pleased to command, that the Name of every Soldier who may hereafter delert shall be transmitted, through the Secretary at War, to the Church Wardens of the Parishes to which the Deserters belong in order that their Names may be exposed to public View in the Church, or fuch other conspicuous Place as may render it impossible, for Men, who have been guilty of this Crime, to return Home to their Friends, on whom they have brought Difgrace by their ifeonduct, without immediate Detection; and His Majesty has further commanded that this Measure shall be made public, that every Soldier may be affured that the greatest Exertions will be used for the Apprehention of any Man who may hereafter desert, and that those who have already been guilty of that Crime may be aware of the daily Rilk they incur of Detection, and of the most severe Punishment, if they do not immediately avail themselves of the Pardon

Any Soldier who may defert after these His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

It is to be clearly understood, that this Proclamation of Pardon is intended to include all Deferters from the Army of Referve and Additional Force Act, but not to extend to any Deferter from His-Majelly's Militia Forces.

#### NEW STAMP DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, September 26, 1808. Otice is hereby given, that by an Act, passed at the Close of the late Session of Parliament, the Stamp Duties on Deeds, Law Proceedings, and other written Instruments, and the Duties on Legacies and Successions to personal Estate upon Intestacies, now payable in Great Britain, are repealed from and after the 10th Day of October next, and other Duties are granted in lieu thereof, to commence immediately after that Day.

The new Duties are of the like Nature, and in general of the fame Amount, with the present Duties; but a more precise and accurate Description is given of the Instruments on which they attach. There are some Duties altogether new, and some new in Amount; of which the principal ones are, ad valorem Duties on Conveyances upon the Sale of any Property, according to the Amount of the Purchale-Money; increased Duties on Promissory Notes allowed to be reissued; and a Duty on Licences to be taken out Yearly by Bankers and others issuing such Promissory Notes. There is also a Duty on Policies of Infurance on Lives, and on Three or Four Law Proceedings, not now charged. The Duties on Mortgages for finall Sums, and on Conveyances on the Sale of Property of small Value, are less than at present. The Duties are contained in a Schedule, in which the Instruments charged are classed and alphabetically arranged, with numerous References, so as to afford a complete Table of Duties in the most convenient and practical Form, and to superfede the Necessity of those Compilations to which the Profession of the Law and the Public have hitherto found it expedient to refort. The Schedule is also framed so as not to admit of an Abridgment that can be fafely relied upon. The Commissioners therefore recommend it to the Profession, and others whom it may concern, to look only to the Schedule
