A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 21st of September 1808,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed by His Orders in Council, of the Sixth of January and Fourth of May laft, to direct certain Measures to be taken for the Care and Custody of Portugues Property belonging to Perfons residing in Portugal or elsewhere, under the Controul of France, which had been detained by British Cruizers, and to subject such Property to the suture Disposition of the Prince Regent of Portugal, in Consideration of the Owners not being entitled to the Possession of the While they remained under the Controul of the Enemy:

And whereas the Deliverance of Portugal from fuch Controul has fince been effected, and the Inhabitants of that Country are again become duly qualified to receive the Reflitution of their Property;

His Majelty is therefore pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Portuguese Property shall be forthwith rellored to the respective Owners thereof, or their lawful Agents; and the Perfons appointed by virtue of the Order in Council of the 6th of January laft, for the Care and Management of the Portuguele Property, are hereby ordered to sectore the fame accordingly; fuch Property neverthelefs being fubject to the Payment of the legal Charges thereon, and of the Expences juftly incurred in respect thereto; and all Questions regard-ing the Ownership of such Property, where any Doubt shall be entertained by the Persons aforesaid, with respect to the fame, and the Charges and Expences thereon, shall be decided upon fummarily by the High Court of Admiralty, or the Court of Vice-Admiralty, in which fuch Property may have been brought to Adjud cation --- And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Ma-Jefty's Treasury, His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admi-ralty, and the Judges of the High Courts of Vice-Admiralty are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

HEREAS by an AQ, passed in the last Sef-VV fion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty, iuti-tuled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act, made in the Forty-fifth Year of His prefent Majefty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act, made in the Forty-feventh Year of His present Ma-jesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be, and the fame is thereby further continued until the Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the Twentythird Day of March last, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the faid Act, to allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twentyfifth Day of the faid Month of March, the Import-ation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, on the Terms specified in the faid Order: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelty's Service, that the laid Permission should be continued for some Time longer, Fary Meafures His Majelty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth W. Fawkener. hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from
