WHEREAS in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majelty by an A&, paffed in'the Fortyfixth Year of His Majeffy's Keign, Cap. 39, inti-tuled "An Act for reviving and continuing fe-veral Laws of Cultoms relating to the eftablifting Courts of Judicature in the Ifland of Newfoundland; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thoufand eight hundred and nine; and for continuing several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax ; to the granting a Bouncy upon the Importation into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undreffed Flax, from His Majelly's Colonies in America, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries ; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain ; and to the Admission to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majetty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from, and reliding in, the faid Illand ; and for continuing an AA of the Taventy-third Year of His-prefent Majefty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships ; and to . the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fifh, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, un til the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand " eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continning an AA, paffed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His prefent Majelty, |

for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twentyfeven; and for amending and further continuing an AC made in the Seventh Year of His prefent Majefty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine:"

His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixth Day of April laft, to permit, for the Space of Six Months, from the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of April, the Im-portation of fundry Articles of Provisions, therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged ex. pedient that the faid Permiffion should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased; by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thouland eight hundred and nive, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney Place of Great, Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and alfo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Pow-der, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any Bri-tish Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belaveing to Perform of any Kingdum on Srate in belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majelty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that shall be imported with the proper Officers of the Cuitoms at the Port where the fume full be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majeky; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners' of His Majelty's Treafury are to give the necellary Directions herein accordingly.

: PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majefty's Regular Land Forces. War-Office, August 25, 1808.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the

Deferters from the different Regular Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to ? return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Inftance of His' Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon' their future Behaviour ; His Majesty has been gracioufly pleafed to grant His Free Pardon to all De-ferters from His Regular Land Forces, who shall furrender themlelves on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of October, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whole Stations

are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Commandant of the Army Depôt in the Ise of Wight.

Such Deserters, it Able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be sent Nottingham. to the Regiments from which they Ipfeuich. respectively deferted, or be appointed to such Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majefty may be pleased to command; and when fo placed, shall not be liable to be claim-2 ed by any other Corps to which they. ·may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other London. Regular Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majefty is gracioully pleafed to extend to fuch Deferters the Benefit of

this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themfelves to their respective. Commanding Officers on or before the Twenty-fourth of October next, and they shall not be liable at any future Time to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved.

The Magistrate to whom any Deserter from His Majefty's Regular Forces may furrender himfelf, is authorized and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered-himfelf ; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Poft, provided he proceed at the-Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at luch Military Poft.

And, with a View to prevent as far as possible all Soldiers from Defertion after these His Majesty's most gracious Intentions shall be made known, His Majesty has been pleafed to command, that the Name of every Soldier who may hereafter defert shall be transmitted, through the Secretary at War, to the Church Wardens of the Parifhes to which the Deferters belong, in order that their Names may be exposed to public View in the Church, or fuch other confpicuous Place as may render it impoffible for Men, who have been guilty of this Crime, to return Home to their Friends, on whom they have brought Difgrace by their Milconduct, without immediate Detection; and His Majefty has further commanded that this Measure shall be made public, that every Soldier may be affured that the greatest Exertions will be nsed for the Apprehen-hon of any Man who may hereaster desert, and that HEREAS it has been reprefented to the those who have already been guilty of that Crime King, that there are at this Time several may be aware of the daily Rik they incur of Desection, and of the molt levere Punishment, if they do not immediately avail themfelves of the Pardon held out in this His Majelty's mult gracious Proclamation.

Any Soldier whio may defert after these His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public,' fhall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

It is to be clearly underflood, that this Proclamation of Pardon is intended to include all Deferters from the Army of Referve and Additional Force ACt, but not to extend to any Deferter from His Majefty's Militia Eorces. d. . .
