ELECTION OF A TEMPORAL PEER OF IRELAND.

THE Writs for electing a Temporal Peer of Ireland to succeed to the Vacancy made in the Representation of the Peerage of Ireland by the Death of the Earl of Clanricarde, will be ready to be delivered at this Office, on Monday the 24th Day of October instant, to the several Lords now entitled to vote, whose Names and Titles of Honour will be published in the London and Dublin Gazettes of that Date, or they will be forwarded by Post to every such Lord who shall send Directions in Writing for that Purpose, and his Address, to this Office. The Writs for such Peers as reside in Dublin will be delivered at their respective Houses.

N. B. By the Act of Union no Peer (except the Twenty-eight Representative Peers) can vote without first taking the Oaths of Allegiance, &c. before a Magistrate in Ireland, after the issuing of the Writs, and before they are returnable.
