ing a Bounty upon the Importation into Great Briz tain of Hemp, and rough and undreffed Flax, from His Majefty's Colonies in America, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain ; and to the Admiffion to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majefty's Subjects carrying on the Fifhery from, and reliding in, the faid Ifland ; and for continuing an AA of the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majefty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufac-tures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Filh, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and con-tinuing an Act, paffed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His prefent Majefty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight bundred and twentyleven; and for amending and further continuing an Act made in the Seventh Year of His prefent Majetty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty fifth Day of March One thouland eight hundred and nine

His Majefly was pleafed by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixth Day of April laft, to permit, for the Space of Six. Moaths, from the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of April, the Importation of fundry Articles of Provitions, therein ipecified, Duty-free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permifinon fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth. Day of March One thouland eight hundred and nine, the Importation into any Port of Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney

be French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and allo of Bulls, Cows, all other Soits of Pulle; and alfo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and 'Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Pow-der; Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Foultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any Bri tifh Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Maiefty, and navioated in any Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whiat loever; provided that a due Entry fhall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that fhall be imported with the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majelty; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners of His Majelty's Treasury are to give the necellary Directions herein accordingly.

dated at Sea, Odober 19, 1808.

SIR, BEG Leave to flate to you, that, cruizing in the Execution of your Orders, this Morning, at Half paft Eight A. M. Kinnaird's Head bearing S. W. by W. Fifteen Leagues, we gave chace to Two Sail in the N. N. W; and a little after Ten recaptured the Sloop Lord Nelfon, in Ballaft, belonging to Leith, that had been captured early this Morning by a Privateer, which, it appeared, was the other Veffel in Company.

Having taken Possefion of this Veffel, we re-newed the Chace after the Privateer, which we also captured at Half paft Eleven A. M., and found her to be the Danish Sloop Frenskernsten, of Four Four-Pounders, Two Swivels, and Twenty-one Men, from Stravangen in Norway, which Place the left on the 15th Initant ; fhe had been on this Coaft Two Days, and the only Capture fhe had made was the above Sloop.


