A PROCLAMATION,

For further continuing, from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to prohibit the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain for a limited Time," it was enacted, that in case We, at any Time after the First Day of October last, should in Our Royal Discretion judge it to be for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom further to continue the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, then and in such Case it should and might be lawful to and for Us, by Our Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, to be issued by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Order in Council to be published from Time to Time in the London Gazette, and in the Dublin Gazette, to continue throughout the United Kingdom, from the said Thirty-first Day of December until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohibition thereinbefore mentioned, that is to say, that throughout the United Kingdom, during the Continuance of such Prohibition, no Worts or Wash for Distillation shall be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the same; and whereas we do judge it for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be further continued, We are thereupon pleased, by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to order and direct that the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain be further continued from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament; and that during that Period no Person shall cause any Worts or Wash for Distillation to be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the same, upon

pain of incurring the Forfeiture in the said Act mentioned.

Given at the Court at the Queen's Palace, the Sixteenth Day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eight, in the Forty-ninth Year of Our Reign.

AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 16th of November 1808,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, for the Payment of the Bounties for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and the Rewards for discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service; and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such Seamen and Landmen on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed in raising Men, will expire on the Thirty-first Day of December next; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows, that is to say,—To every Able Seaman not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman so entering himself, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings; to every Able-bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, so entering himself, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; to any Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordinary Seaman or Seamen who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Officers employed to raise Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every such Able

Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every such Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships; to any Person or Persons who shall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for His Majesty's Service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men, a Reward of Three Guineas for every such Able Seaman, Two Guineas for every such Ordinary Seaman, and One Guinea for every such Landman, together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile such Men may respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Residence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men; provided such Man shall be found fit for His Majesty's Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice: And whereas it is expedient that the said several Bounties, Rewards, and Travelling Allowance should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the said Bounties, Rewards, and Travelling Allowance be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first Day of December next to the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and nine, inclusive; and that the same be paid in the Manner specified in His Majesty's several Proclamations now in Force for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving Rewards for procuring the voluntary Service of Seamen and Landmen; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act, passed in the Forty sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 29, intitled "An Act for reviving and continuing several Laws of Customs relating to the establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine; and for continuing several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax; to the granting a Bounty upon the Importation into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undressed Flax, from His Majesty's Colonies in America, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries; and for reviving and continuing several Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ire-

land, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and to the Admission to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from, and residing in, the said Island; and for continuing an Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing several Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven; and for amending and further continuing an Act made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine:"

His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixth Day of April last, to permit, for the Space of Six Months, from the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of April, the Importation of sundry Articles of Provisions, therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be imported with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

Whitehall, November 22, 1808.
Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, about One o'Clock in the Morning of the 18th Ultimo, William Stockton, John Tucker, William Winn, and Lancelot Thompson, Officers of Excise, with Four Men acting as their Assistants, after having discovered that the Warehouse at one of the Salt Works at Lawton, in Cheshire, had been clandestinely entered, and a Quantity of Salt taken therefrom, for which the Duties had not been paid, and a Part of which was found upon a Person now in Custody, were violently assaulted by about Twenty Men, armed with large Sticks and other Weapons, one of whom discharged a Gun at them, and wounded the first of the said Officers with small Shot in the Hand, Neck, Shoulder, and Arm;

His Majesty, for the Purpose of bringing these atrocious Offenders to Justice, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Accomplice (except the Person that actually fired at the Officers, and the Person in Custody as aforesaid,) who shall discover any one or more of them, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted. HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons (except as before mentioned) who shall make such Discovery, the same to be paid by their Secretary upon the Conviction.

POST HORSE DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, London, November 12, 1808.
Notice is hereby given, that by virtue of an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for letting to farm the Duties on Horses hired by the Mile or Stage to be used in travelling, and on Horses hired for a less Period of Time than Twenty-eight Days for drawing Carriages used in travelling Post or otherwise in Great Britain, and for better securing the said Duties;" the Commissioners of Stamps, duly authorised by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, will put up the said Duties (which were granted by the Act of the Forty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, c. 98.) at the Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, on Friday the 16th of December next, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Forenoon, to be let to farm at Yearly Rents, for the Term of Three Years from the 1st Day of February next inclusive, in the several Districts or Lots following, viz.

Each District will be put up at the Sum above set opposite thereto, which, if there be no Bidding, will be gradually abated down to a certain Point, or till a Bidding shall be made. The highest Bidder will be declared the Farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank Notes, One-Eighth Part of the Annual Rent as a Deposit; but if no sufficient Bidding shall be made for any District, it will be withdrawn.

And it is intended, that the Districts shall not be put up in the Order above stated, but in any other which the Commissioners of Stamps may think fit, and which will not be declared before the Time of letting.

All Persons, intending to bid for any of the said Duties, are to deliver in their Proposals, addressed to the Commissioners at the Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, at least Three Days previous to the said 16th Day of December next, signed with their Names, stating the Places of their Abode, and specifying the District or Districts for which they intend to bid, otherwise their Proposals cannot be proceeded upon.

And no Persons licensed to let Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any one for their Use, can be admitted to contract for any of the said Duties.

To Innkeepers and others letting Horses to hire, as well as to Persons intending to bid for any of the said Duties,

Notice is also given, that by the above mentioned Act of the last Session, all Licences for letting Horses to hire, granted previously to the 31st of January next, will expire on that Day, and all Licences to be granted after that Day, will expire on the 31st of January following the Date thereof; but for the Convenience of the Persons concerned, and to give Time for obtaining Licences, all such as shall be granted between the 31st of January and the 16th of March in any Year, will be dated on the 1st of February, and will protect from that Day. The Act also contains divers new Provisions and Regulations for better securing the Duties and preventing Frauds, as well as for facilitating the Recovery of the Duties, and the Penalties for Offences relating thereto, which will be found beneficial to the Farmers thereof; and Innkeepers and others letting Horses to hire will be subject to Penalties if they neglect to conform to such Regulations.
