A PROCLAMATION,

For further continuing, from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to prohibit the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain for a limited Time," it was enacted, that in case We, at any Time after the First Day of October last, should in Our Royal Discretion judge it to be for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom further to continue the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, then and in such Case it should and might be lawful to and for Us, by Our Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, to be issued by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Order in Council to be published from Time to Time in the London Gazette, and in the Dublin Gazette, to continue throughout the United Kingdom, from the said Thirty-first Day of December until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohibition thereinbefore mentioned, that is to say, that throughout the United Kingdom, during the Continuance of such Prohibition, no Worts or Wash for Distillation shall be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the same; and whereas we do judge it for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be further continued, We are thereupon pleased, by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to order and direct that the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain be further continued from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament; and that during that Period no Person shall cause any Worts or Wash for Distillation to be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the same, upon

pain of incurring the Forfeiture in the said Act mentioned.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Eighth Day of December next, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Eighth Day of December next, to Monday the Sixteenth Day of January next; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do further hereby, with the Advice afore said, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Sixteenth Day of January next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Sixteenth Day of January next.

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Eighth Day of November One thousand eight hun-

dred and seven, for the Payment of the Bounties for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and the Rewards for discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service; and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such Seamen and Landmen on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed in raising Men, will expire on the Thirty-first Day of December next; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows, that is to say,—To every Able Seaman not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman so entering himself, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings; to every Able-bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, so entering himself, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; to any Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordinary Seaman or Seamen who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Officers employed to raise Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every such Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every such Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships; to any Person or Persons who shall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for His Majesty's Service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men, a Reward of Three Guineas for every such Able Seaman, Two Guineas for every such Ordinary Seaman, and One Guinea for every such Landman, together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile such Men may respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Residence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men; provided such Man shall be found fit for His Majesty's Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice: And whereas it is expedient that the said several Bounties, Rewards, and Travelling Allowance should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the said Bounties, Rewards, and Travelling Allowance be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first Day of December next to the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and nine, inclusive, and that the same be paid in the Manner specified in His Majesty's several Proclamations now in Force for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving Rewards for procuring the voluntary Service of Seamen and Landmen; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth Day of May last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of December next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Mends, of His Majesty's Ship *Arethusa*, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated at Sea, November 26, 1808.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour of informing you, that this Morning, to the N. E. of Alderney about Eight or Nine Leagues, I gave Chace to a Lugger, which we saw steering for the Coast of France, and, after a beautiful run of Four Hours, had the good Fortune of bringing her to. She proved to be the General Ernouf French Privateer belonging to Calais, but had failed from Cherbourg Eight Days before without having made any Capture; mounts Sixteen Guns, and had Fifty-eight Men on board, commanded by a Jacques Antoine de Boulogne, a Man who has cruized for Fifteen Years successfully against our Trade, without having been taken before. From the very superior sailing of the General Ernouf, it is fortunate, Sir, that she was met by the *Arethusa*; and should a fine Vessel of this Description be wanted for His Majesty's Service, I would beg Leave to recommend her, as being suitable in every Respect; and have the Honour to be, &c.

The King, taking into His Royal Consideration, the Zeal, Courage, and Perseverance of the late George Nicholas Hardinge, Esq; Captain of His Majesty's Frigate *San Fiorenzo*, manifested by him, upon divers Occasions, but more especially in the Capture of the Dutch War Brig *Atalanta*, off the Texel, after a desperate Conflict, in the Night of 31st March 1804, by the successful Enterprize of boarding and of cutting out that Vessel, himself at the Head of the Party in the Boats, and the first Man who boarded her; and also in the signal and gallant Service of commencing Three successive Engagements between His Majesty's Frigate *San Fiorenzo* and *La Piedmontaise*, a French Frigate, off Ceylon, in March, last, notwithstanding the great Disparity of the Force between the said Frigates, that of the Enemy carrying Fifty Guns, and mustering Five Hundred and Sixty-six Men, when His Majesty's Frigate carried only Thirty-eight Guns, and mustered One Hundred and Eighty-six Men, including Officers; a Conflict terminated in the Capture of the Enemy's Frigate, but, unfortunately, in the Death of the said Captain Hardinge, who fell with Glory in the last of the said Three Actions; His Majesty has been graciously pleased, in Commemoration thereof, to grant His Royal Licence and Permission, that the Male Descendants of the late Nicholas Hardinge, Esq; paternal Grandfather of the said Captain George Nicholas Hardinge, who died without Issue, may bear for ever hereafter, to the Armorial Ensigns of their Family, the following honourable Augmentations, viz. To the Arms of Hardinge (being "On a Cheveron fimbriated Three Escallops") *A Chief wavy, thereon a dismantled French Frigate, with her Colours struck, towed by an English Frigate*; and, for an additional Crest, (that of Hardinge being "A Mitre charged with a Cheveron, as in the Arms,") the following, viz. *A Hand, couped above the Wrist, grasping the Sword of a British Naval Officer, erect, surmounting a Dutch and a French Flag in Saltire, on the former inscribed "ATALANTA,"*

on the latter "PIEDMONTAISE," the Blade of the Sword passing through a Wreath of Laurel near the Point, and, a little below, through another of *Egypte*; with this Motto "POSTERA LAUDE RECENS;" provided such honourable Augmentations be first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office:

And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and special Mark of His Royal Favour, be registered in His College of Arms.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that, about One o'Clock in the Morning of the 18th Ultimo, William Stockton, John Tucker, William Winn, and Lancelot Thompson, Officers of Excise, with Four Men acting as their Assistants, after having discovered that the Warehouse at one of the Salt-Works at Laruton; in Cheshire, had been clandestinely entered, and a Quantity of Salt taken therefrom, for which the Duties had not been paid, and a Part of which was found upon a Person now in Custody, were violently assaulted by about Twenty Men, armed with large Sticks and other Weapons, one of whom discharged a Gun at them, and wounded the first of the said Officers with small Shot in the Hand, Neck, Shoulder, and Arm;

His Majesty, for the Purpose of bringing these atrocious Offenders to Justice, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Accomplice (except the Person that actually fired at the Officers, and the Person in Custody as aforesaid,) who shall discover any one or more of them, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted.

POST HORSE DUTIES.

Notice is hereby given, that by virtue of an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for letting to farm the Duties on Horses hired by the Mile or Stage to be used in travelling, and on Horses hired for a less Period of Time than Twenty-eight Days for drawing Carriages used in travelling. Post or otherwise in Great Britain, and for better securing the said Duties;" the Commissioners of Stamps, duly authorized by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, will put up the said Duties (which were granted by the Act of the Forty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, c. 98.) at the Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, on Friday the 16th of December next, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Forenoon, to be let to farm at Yearly Rents, for the Term of Three Years from the 1st Day of February next inclusive, in the several Districts or Lots following, viz.

Each District will be put up at the Sum above set opposite thereto, which, if there be no Bidding, will be gradually abated down to a certain Point, or till a Bidding shall be made. The highest Bidder will be declared the Farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank Notes, One-Eighth Part of the

Annual Rent as a Deposit; but if no sufficient Bidding shall be made for any District, it will be withdrawn.

And it is intended, that the Districts shall not be put up in the Order above stated, but in any other which the Commissioners of Stamps may think fit, and which will not be declared before the Time of letting.

All Persons intending to bid for any of the said Duties, are to deliver in their Proposals, addressed to the Commissioners at the Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, at least Three Days previous to the said 16th Day of December next, signed with their Names, stating the Places of their Abode, and specifying the District or Districts for which they intend to bid, otherwise their Proposals cannot be proceeded upon.

And no Persons licensed to let Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any one for their Use, can be admitted to contract for any of the said Duties.

To Innkeepers and others letting Horses to hire, as well as to Persons intending to bid for any of the said Duties,

Notice is also given, that by the above mentioned Act of the last Session, all Licences for letting Horses to hire, granted previously to the 31st of January next, will expire on that Day, and all Licences to be granted after that Day, will expire on the 31st of January following the Date thereof; but for the Convenience of the Persons concerned, and to give Time for obtaining Licences, all such as shall be granted between the 31st of January and the 16th of March in any Year, will be dated on the 1st of February, and will protect from that Day. The Act also contains divers new Provisions and Regulations for better securing the Duties and preventing Frauds, as well as for facilitating the Recovery of the Duties, and the Penalties for Offences relating thereto, which will be found beneficial to the Farmers thereof; and Innkeepers and others letting Horses to hire will be subject to Penalties if they neglect to conform to such Regulations.
