## PROCLAMATION.

For further continuing, from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohibition of the Diffillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to prohibit the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain for a limited Time," it was enacted, that in case We, at any Time after the First Day of October last, should in Our Royal Discretion judge it to be for the Benesit and Advantage of Our Kingdom further to continue the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or-Grain from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, then and in such Case it should and might be lawful to and for Us, by Our Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, to be iffued by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Order in Council to he published from Time to Time in the London Gazette, and in the Dublin Gazette, to continue throughout the United Kingdom, from the faid Thirty-first Day of December until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohibition thereinbefore mentioned, that is to fay, that throughout the United Kingdom, during the Continuance of such Prohibition, no Worts or Wash for Dittillation shall be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Coin or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the same; and whereas we do judge it for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be further continued, We are thereupon pleased, by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to order and direct that the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain be further continued from the Thirtyfirst Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament; and that during that Period no Person shall cause any Worts or Wash for Dishillation to be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the same, upon

pain of incurring the Forfeiture in the faid Act inentioned.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Eighth Day of December next, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Eighth Day of December next, to Monday the Sixteenth Day of January next; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Com-million for proroguing the fame accordingly: And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforelaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure that the faid Parliament shall, on the said Sixteenth Day of January next, be held and fit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are:hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance. accordingly, at Wellminster, on the faid Sixteenth Day of January next.
