POST HORSE DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, London, November 12, 1808.

Notice is hereby given, that by virtue of an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intitled "An Act for letting to farm the Duties on Horses hired by the Mile or Stage to be used in travelling, and on Horses hired for a less Period of Time than Twenty-eight Days for drawing Carriages used in travelling.
