#### PROCLAMATION. А

For further continuing, from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meet-ing of Parliament, the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to prohibit the Diftillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain for a limited Time," it was enacted, that in cafe We, at any Time after the First Day of October last, should in Our Royal Diferetion judge it to be for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom further to continue the Prohibition of the Distillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain from the Thirty-first Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, then and in fuch Cafe it fhould and might be lawful to and for Us, by Our Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, to be iffued by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Order in Council to be published from Time to Time in the London Gazette, and in the Dublin Gazette, to continue throughout the United Kingdom, from the faid Thirty-first Day of December until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament, the Prohi-bition thereinbefore mentioned, that is to fay, that throughout the United Kingdom, during the Continuance of fuch Prohibition, no Worts or Wash for Distillation shall be made from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the fame; and whereas we do judge it for the Benefit and Advantage of Our Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be further continued, We are thereupon pleafed, by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the Ad-vice of Our Privy Council, to order and direct that the Prohibition of the Dillillation of Spirits from Corn or Grain be further continued from the Thirtyfirst Day of December next until Forty Days after the next Meeting of Parliament; and that during that Period no Perfon shall caufe any Worts or Wash for Distillation to be made from Oats, Barley, for any other Corn or Grain, or from Malt, Flour, or Bran, or any Mixture with the fame, upon High Court of Chancery.
