"The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IIIS Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that those Ports and Places of the Bland of St. Domingo, which are not in the actual Possession of France, and from which the British Flag is not excluded, shall be considered as not being in a State of Hottlitty with His Majelly, and that His Majelly's Subjects and others are at Liberty freely to trade thereat, in the same Manner as they may trade at Neutral Ports and Places;

Provided nevertheless, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect any Question now depending in His Majesty's Tribunals respecting the Character of the said Ports and Places; but such Queition shall be decided in the same Manner as if His Order and Declaration had not iffued:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Com-missioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of His Majesty's Courts of Vice Admiralty, are to take Notice of His Majesty's Pleasure hereby signified, and go-W. Fawkener. vern themfelves accordingly.

The Queen's Palace, December 21, 1808. This Day Admiral Apodaca had a private Audience of His Majesty to deliver his Letters of Credence as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Supreme Junta of Spain, in the Name of His Catholic Majesty Ferdinand the Seventh.
