juilly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty: Our Will is, therefore, and We charge that this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith proceed to the Market-Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published: And We do appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds; and that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day abovementioned, the fame may be pubilifhed and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, this Twenty first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eight, in the Forty-ninth Year of Our Reign.

IT is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament, which was to meet on Monday the Sixteenth Day of January next, be further prorogued to Thursday the Nineteenth Day of the fame Month, then to meet for the Difpatch of Bufinels : And the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to caule a Commission to be prepared in the ufual Manuer for proroguing the Parliament accordingly. "The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council.

TIS Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleafed to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that those Ports and Places of the Island of St. Domingo, which are not in the actual Poffestion of France, and from which the British Flag is not excluded, shall be confidered as not being in a State of Hotlility with His Majelty, and that His Majelty's Subjects and others are at Liberty freely to trade thereat, in the fame Manner as they may trade at Neutral Ports and Places;

Provided nevertheles, that nothing herein con-tained shall be construed to affect any Question now depending in His Majefty's Tribunals respecting the Character of the faid Ports and Places; but fuch Queition shall be decided in the same Manner as if Hus Order and Declaration had not illued :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiftioners of His Majefty's Treasfury, the Lords Com-millioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of His Majefty's Courts of Vice Admiralty, are to take Notice of His Majefty's Pleafure hereby fignified, and go-W. Fawkener. vern themlelves accordingly.
