HIS Majesty, in virtue of the Powers reserved to Him by Two certain Acts, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, the one intituled "An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, Duties of Customs on the Goods, Wares, and Merchandises therein enumerated, in furtherance of the Provisions of certain Orders in Council;" the other intituled "An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, certain Duties on the Exportation from Ireland of Goods, Wares, and Merchandise therein enumerated;" is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, until further Order shall be made herein, the Operation of the aforesaid Acts be suspended as to any Duties on Exportation granted by the said Acts, so far as relates to Articles being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any Country for the Time being in Amity with His Majesty, and from the Ports of which the British Flag is not excluded, which Articles have been or shall be imported direct from such Country into any Port or Place of the United Kingdom, either in British Ships, or in Ships of the Country of which such Articles are the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture:

And His Majesty is further pleased, with the Advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Operation of the aforesaid Acts be in like Manner suspended as to any Duties on the Exportation of Goods, Wares, or Merchandise which have been or may be condemned as Prize:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. *W. Falkener.*

LEGACY DUTY.

TO EXECUTORS AND ADMINISTRATORS.

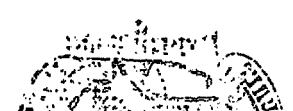
