P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fourth Day of July last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of January next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of January next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation

" or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purpose of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, (except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by

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the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Grease, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the said Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the said Articles during the same Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the same Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *W. Fawkenner.*

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty, in virtue of the Powers reserved to Him by Two certain Acts, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, the one intituled "An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, Duties of Customs on the Goods, Wares, and Merchandises therein enumerated, in furtherance of the Provisions of certain Orders in Council;" the other intituled "An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, certain Duties on the Exportation from Ireland of Goods, Wares, and Merchandise therein enumerated;" is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, until further Order shall be made herein, the Operation of the aforesaid Acts be suspended as to any Duties on Exportation granted by the said Acts, so far as relates to Articles being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any Country for the Time being in Amity with His Majesty, and from the Ports of which the British Flag is not excluded, which Articles have been or shall be imported direct from such Country into any

Port or Place of the United Kingdom, either in British Ships, or in Ships of the Country of which such Articles are the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture:

And His Majesty is further pleased, with the Advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Operation of the aforesaid Acts be in like Manner suspended as to any Duties on the Exportation of Goods, Wares, or Merchandise which have been or may be condemned as Prize:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. *W. Fawkenner.*

Provided nevertheless, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect any Question now depending in His Majesty's Tribunals respecting the Character of the said Ports and Places; but such Question shall be decided in the same Manner as if this Order and Declaration had not issued:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of His Majesty's Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take Notice of His Majesty's Pleasure hereby signified, and govern themselves accordingly. *W. SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to inform you, that, on the 21st Instant, the Scaw bearing S. by E. Twelve Leagues, I fell in with and, after a Chase of Two Hours, captured the Danish Schooner Privateer Nærois, of Ten Guns, Giermund Holm, Master, with a Complement of Thirty-six Men, but had on board only Twenty-six; out from Fridricksvern one Day, without taking any Thing.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Dundas, of His Majesty's Ship Naiad, to Captain Beresford, of the Theseus, dated off the Entrance of the Loire, the 17th Instant, and transmitted by the latter to the Honourable W. W. Pole.

I BEG Leave to acquaint you, for the Information of the Commander in Chief, that last Evening at Eight, the Naiad and Narcissus being close in with Noirmoutier, we discovered and soon captured the French Privateer Brig Fanny, of Sixteen Guns and Eighty Men, commanded by Charles Hamon, and only a few Hours from Nantz, and consequently had made no Capture. She was intended to cruise off the Coast of Ireland; and at Midnight we captured the French Sloop Superb, Letter of Marque, of Four Guns and Twenty Men, with a Cargo of Sundries for Martinique. Mr. Hamon lately commanded the Venus Privateer, that did great Injury to our Trade.
