T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 14th of December 1808,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fourth Day of July laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum; Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of January next : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelly's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition flould be continued for some Time longer, His Majelty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of January next, prefume to transport into any Farts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Maits, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do thip or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majetty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majelty's Reign, intituled " An " Act to enable His Majefty to reltrain the Expor-* tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and "Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffeeners, for

" or Order ia Council:" But it is nevertheles His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy ; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Use of such Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpole of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majcity's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonics and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oatli of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Boud, (except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Courmillioners of His Majelty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they, are fo entered outwards, and for the Purpofes fp :cified, and none other; and inch Bond Shall nor be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made
