A PROCLAMATION, For a General Fuff.

GEORGE R.

M7 E, taking into Our most serious Consideration W the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will graciously bles Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Gur Privy Council, hereby com-mand, that a Publick Day of Fatting and Humi-liation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thurfday the Ninth Day of February next en-fuing; that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almight God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and, in the molt devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deferved, and for imploring His Bleffing and Affiftance on our Arms for the Refloration of Peace and Profperity to Us and Our Dominions: And We do Ilrichly charge and com-mond that the faid Publick Falt be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Sentland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty Grd, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punifement as We may judly infiel on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty: Our Will is, therefore, and We charge that this Our Proclamation feer, ye forthwith proceed to the Market-Crois of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereoi, that none pretend 1gnorance : And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor en caule printed Copies hercof to be fent to the Sheriffshof the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame publified: And We do appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parifh Churches within their Bounds; and that upon the Lord's Day immediately preced-ing the Day abovementioned, the fame may be publifted and read from the Pulpits-immediately after Divine Service.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, this Twenty-field Day of December Oat thousand eight hundred and eight, in the Forty-ninth Year of Our Reign.

E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the juft and neceffary War in which We are eng: yed, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have referved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby com-mar, that a Publick Day of Falling and Humi-liati n be observed throughout those Parts of Our Uni d Kingdom called England and Ireland, on We refday the Eighth Day of February next en-fuin : that fo both We and Our People may humble Our lives before Almighty God, in order to obtain Par. on of Our Sins, and, in the most devout and fole ... n Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplicall is to the Divine Majelly for averting those heas Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deferved, and for imploring His Bleting and Affiliance on Our Arms for the Refor tion of Peace and Profperity to Us and Our Doi, inions : And We do Itrictly charge and command that the faid Publick Falt be reverently and devoitly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Aln. ghty God, and would avoid his Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We say justly inflict on fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necefiary a Dut : And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Mof. Reverend the Archbifhops, and the Righe Reverend the Bifhops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occation to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship; and to take care that the fame be timely difperfed throughout their refpective Diogefes.
