

Magistral Courts, that the Duties granted by the Acts of the 36 Geo. 3. c. 52, 44 Geo. 3. c. 98, and 45 Geo. 3. c. 28, have not been paid in respect of divers Legacies and Annuities bequeathed by Will out of Personal or Real Estate, and in respect of divers Residues of Personal Estate given by Will, or devolved to Next of Kin upon Intestacies, particularly in Cases where the Executors were themselves Legatees, or Residuary Legatees, and where the Administrators were the sole Next of Kin of the Deceased;

This is to give Notice, that the Commissioners of Stamps are empowered, by an Act of the last Session of Parliament, to remit the Penalties incurred by Executors and others in consequence of the Non-Payment of the abovementioned Duties within the Time prescribed by Law, provided the same be paid on or before the 31st of January 1809; and that after that Day the Commissioners of Stamps will proceed to institute Prosecutions in the Exchequer against such Executors and Administrators as shall not avail themselves of the Indemnity offered, for recovering the Arrears of the said Duties.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented to the King, that, some Time during the Night of Friday the 20th Instant, James Crick, residing in the Parish of Lidington, near Woburn, in the County of Bedford, and his Housekeeper, Rebecca Rudd, were most inhumanly murdered by some Person or Persons unknown;

The said James Crick had returned Home from Woburn Market about Half-past Five on Friday Evening, his Body was found about Eleven o'Clock on Saturday Morning, nearly a Mile from his Home, by a Footpath leading from the Parish of Lidington; he had received Two Stabs in the Belly, and his Throat had been cut with a sharp Instrument. The Body of the said Rebecca Rudd was found upon the Landing-Place of the Staircase in the House of the said James Crick, with her Throat cut in a Manner nearly similar;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in these atrocious Murders, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually committed the said Murders) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
