And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by His Grace the Duke of Bedford, to any Person making juch Discovery as aforefaid, (except as is before ex cepted) to be paid on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
