Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that the Body of Mr. George Johnstone, a First Lieutenant of one of His Majesty's Ships lying at the Nore, was found on Saturday Morning last, near the Five Bells in the Kent Road, most inhumanly murdered. The said Mr. Johnstone was in his Way to Deptford, and, it is supposed, that, about Half-past One o'Clock in the Morning, he was attacked by Three Men, who were seen near the Spot about that Time, one of them answering the following Description, viz. About Five Feet Nine or Ten Inches high, of a very swarthy Complexion, with large dark Whiskers, dressed in a close-bodied Blue Coat with Yellow Buttons, a light coloured Waistcoat, light drab coloured Breeches, dark worsted Stockings, Shoes fastened with a small Buckle at the Side, and a good round Hat; at that Time his Pockets appeared to be full;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in such an atrocious Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually committed the same) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
