to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the same Scason; and provided also that the Exportation of the faid Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necellary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
