WHEREAS it is expedient further to encourage the Trade from Malta to Countries under the Restrictions contained in His Majesty's Order in Council dated the Eleventh Day of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Licences be granted by the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or other Person having the chief Civil Command at Malta, but in His Majesty's Name, to such Person or Persons as the said Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Person having the chief Civil Command, shall think fit, allowing such Person or Persons to export from Malta *direct* to any Port or Ports within the Straights of Gibraltar, any Articles of the Produce or Manufacture of His Majesty's Dominions, and any Articles which shall have been imported into Malta from this Kingdom, or from any Port or Place within the Straights of Gibraltar, (not being Naval or Military Stores,) in any Vessel belonging to any of *His Majesty's Subjects*, or in any Vessel belonging to any Country not at War with His Majesty, or in any Vessel not exceeding One Hundred Tons Burthen, and being unarmed, belonging to any Country within the said Straights; and also to import in any such Vessel or Vessels as aforesaid, from any Port within the Straights of Gibraltar to Malta aforesaid, (the Port of Destination being specified in such Licence,) any Articles whatsoever, and to whomsoever the same may appear to belong, such Articles to be specified in the Bill of Lading of such Vessel; subject, however, to such further Regulations and Restrictions with respect to all or any of such Articles so to be exported or imported, as to the said Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or other Person having the chief Civil Command at Malta aforesaid for the

Time being respectively, shall from Time to Time seem fit and expedient.

And it is further ordered, that in every such Licence shall be inserted the Names and Residence of the Person or Persons to whom it shall be granted, the Articles and their Quantities permitted to be exported, the Name and Description of the Vessel, and of the Master thereof, and the Port or Ports to which the Vessel shall be allowed to go; and that no Licence so to be granted shall continue in Force for longer Time than Four Months from its Date, nor for more than One Voyage; nor shall any such Licence be granted, or acknowledged to be valid if granted, to permit the Clearance of any Vessel to any Port which shall be actually blockaded by any Naval Force of His Majesty or His Allies.

And it is further ordered, that the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War and Privateers, and all others whom it may concern, shall suffer every such Vessel sailing conformably to the Permission given by this Order, and having any such Licence as aforesaid, to pass and repass *direct* between Malta and such Port or Ports within the Straights of Gibraltar as shall be specified in the Licence, in such Manner, and under such Terms, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be expressed therein.

And it is further ordered, that in case any Vessel so sailing as aforesaid, for which any such Licence as aforesaid shall have been granted, and which shall be proceeding *direct* upon her said Voyage, shall be detained and brought in for legal Adjudication, such Vessel, with her Cargo, shall be forthwith released by the Court of Admiralty in which Proceedings shall be commenced, upon Proof being made that the Parties had duly conformed to the Terms, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Licence; the Proof of such Conformity to lie upon the Person or Persons claiming the Benefit of this Order, or obtaining or using such Licence, or claiming the Benefit thereof.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's

Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 21st of December last, by virtue of the Powers reserved to His Majesty by Two certain Acts therein mentioned, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, to order, and it was thereby ordered, that, until further Order should be made therein, the Operation of the said Acts should be suspended as to any Duties on Exportation granted by the said Acts, as far as related to Articles being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any Country for the Time being in Amity with His Majesty, and from the Ports of which the British Flag is not excluded, which Articles had been or should be imported direct from such Country into any Port or Place of the United Kingdom, either in British Ships, or in Ships of the Country of which such Articles are the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the Powers reserved to His Majesty by the said Two Acts, that the Operation of the aforesaid Acts be in like Manner suspended as to any Duties on Exportation granted by the said Acts, so far as relates to Articles being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any Country for the Time being in Amity with His Majesty, and from the Ports of which the British Flag is not excluded, which Articles have been or shall be imported direct from such Country into Gibraltar, Malta, or any of the British Free Ports in His Majesty's West India Islands, and from thence in British Ships into any Port or Place of the United Kingdom. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tal-

low, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act, made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act, made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be, and the same is thereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the Twenty-first Day of September last, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act, to allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twenty-fifth Day of the said Month of September, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, on the Terms specified in the said Order: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant March, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and His Majesty doth hereby order, that, on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, with any of the Articles above-mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.— And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to continue so much of an Act of the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty as allows

a Bounty upon Double Refined Sugar exported, until the 25th Day of March 1811, and so much of the same Act as allows a Bounty on Raw Sugar exported until the 25th Day of March 1810.

An Act for further continuing, until the 25th Day of March 1810, certain Bounties and Drawbacks on the Exportation of Sugar from Great Britain, and for suspending the countervailing Duties and Bounties on Sugar, when the Duties imposed by an Act of the Forty-sixth Year of His present Majesty shall be suspended.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act to indemnify such Persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments, and for extending the Times limited for those Purposes respectively until the 25th Day of March 1810, and to permit such Persons in Great Britain as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors to make and file the same, on or before the first Day of Hilary Term 1810.

An Act for the more effectually preventing the forging of Bank Notes, Bank Bills of Exchange, and Bank Post Bills, and the Negotiation of forged and counterfeited Bank Notes, Bank Bills of Exchange, and Bank Post Bills, of the Governor and Company of the Bank of Ireland.

An Act for repealing an Act of the Parliament of Scotland relative to Child Murder, and for making other Provisions in lieu thereof.
