P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to encourage the Trade from Malta to Countries under the Restrictions contained in His Majesty's Order in Council dated the Eleventh Day of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Licences be granted by the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or other Person having the chief Civil Command at Malta, but in His Majesty's Name, to such Person or Persons as the said Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Person having the chief Civil Command, shall think fit, allowing such Person or Persons to export from Malta direct to any Port or Ports within the Streights of Gibraltar, any Articles of the Produce or Manufacture of His Majesty's Dominions, and any Articles which shall have been imported into Malta from this Kingdom, or from any Port or Place within the Streights of Gibraltar, (not being Naval or Military Stores,) in any Vessel belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or in any Vessel belonging to any Country not at War with His Majesty, or in any Vessel not exceeding One Hundred Tons Burthen, and being unarmed, belonging to any Country within the said Streights; and also to import in any such Vessel or Vessels as aforesaid, from any Port within the Streights of Gibraltar to Malta aforesaid, (the Port and Destination being specified in such Licence,) any Articles whatsoever, and to whomsoever the same may appear to belong, such Articles to be specified in the Bill of Lading of such Vessel; subject, however, to such further Regulations and Restrictions with respect to all or any of such Articles so to be exported or imported, as to the said Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or other Person having the chief Civil Command at Malta aforesaid for the Time being respectively, shall from Time to Time seem fit and expedient.

And it is further ordered, that in every such

Licence shall be inserted the Names and Residence of the Person or Persons to whom it shall be granted, the Articles and their Quantities permitted to be exported, the Name and Description of the Vessel, and of the Master thereof, and the Port or Ports to which the Vessel shall be allowed to go; and that no Licence so to be granted shall continue in Force for longer Time than Four Months from its Date, nor for more than One Voyage; nor shall any such Licence be granted, or acknowledged to be valid if granted, to permit the Clearance of any Vessel to any Port which shall be actually blockaded by any Naval Force of His Majesty or His Allies.

And it is further ordered, that the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War and Privateers, and all others whom it may concern, shall suffer every such Vessel sailing conformably to the Permission given by this Order, and having any such Licence as aforesaid, to pass and repass direct between Malta and such Port or Ports within the Streights of Gibraltar as shall be specified in the Licence, in such Manner, and under such Terms, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be expressed therein.

And it is further ordered, that in case any Vessel so sailing as aforesaid, for which any such Licence as aforesaid shall have been granted, and which shall be proceeding direct upon her said Voyage, shall be detained and brought in for legal Adjudication, such Vessel, with her Cargo, shall be forthwith released by the Court of Admiralty in which Proceedings shall be commenced, upon Proof being made that the Parties had duly conformed to the Terms, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Licence; the Proof of such Conformity to lie upon the Person or Persons claiming the Benefit of this Order, or obtaining or using such Licence, or claiming the Benefit thereof.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 21st of December last, by virtue of the Powers reserved to His Majesty by Two certain Acts therein mentioned, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, to order, and it was thereby ordered, that, until further Order should be made therein, the Operation of the said Acts should be suspended as to any Duties on Exportation granted by the said Acts, as far as related to Articles being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any Country for the Time being in Amity with His Majesty, and from the Ports of which the British Flag is not excluded, which Articles had been or should be imported direct from such Country into any Port or Place of the United Kingdom, either in British Ships, or in Ships of the Country of which such Articles are the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the Powers reserved to His Majesty by the said Two Acts, that the Operation of the aforesaid Acts be in like Manner suspended as to any Duties on Exportation granted by the said Acts, so far as relates to Articles being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any Country for the Time being in Amity with His Majesty, and from the Ports of which the British Flag is not excluded, which Articles have been or shall be imported direct from such Country into Gibraltar, Malta, or any of the British Free Ports in His Majesty's West India Islands, and from thence in British Ships into any Port or Place of the United Kingdom. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for further continuing, until the 25th Day of March 1810, an Act made in the Thirtieth Year of His present Majesty, for prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty.

An Act for charging with Duty Spent Wash redistilled in Great Britain.

An Act to permit, until the 25th Day of March 1811, the Importation of Tobacco into Great Britain from any Place whatever.

An Act for allowing, until the 25th Day of March 1810, the Importation of certain Fish from Parts of the Coast of His Majesty's North American Colonies, and for granting a Bounty thereon.

An Act for establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland, and the Islands adjacent, and for re-annexing Part of the Coast of Labrador, and the Islands lying on the said Coast, to the Government of Newfoundland.

An Act to enable the Clerk of the King's Counsel and Attorney in the Court of King's Bench to be admitted as Attornies.

An Act for more effectually repairing, improving, and keeping in Repair several Roads in the Counties of Brecon, Radnor, and Glamorgan; and for making and maintaining Two new Branches of Road to communicate therewith.

SIR,

I BEG to acquaint you, that I have this Day captured the French Letter of Marque *L'Iphigénie*, pierced for Eighteen Guns, but had only Six mounted, and Twenty-six Men, from Bayonne to Guadaloupe, laden with Naval Stores and various Merchandize. She is coppered, and sails remarkably fast, having been pursued several Times during her

Passage, and led the Franchise a Chace of Thirty Hours in her favourite Point of sailing, during which Time she threw her Guns overboard, and cut away her Anchors, in order to effect her Escape. She was built at Bayonne, and launched about Two Months ago, for the exprefs Purpose of a Privateer in the West Indies, and, in my humble Opinion, is calculated for His Majesty's Service.

SIR,

THE Chace of this Morning, which I captured at Eleven A. M. proves La Gobe Mouche Imperial Corvette, pierced for Twelve Guns, but most thrown overboard during the Chace, commanded by Enseigne de Vaisseau Sugor, from the Seychelles, bound to Port Louis with Dispatches, which he threw overboard, but were saved by the Activity of our Boat's Crew, at least a considerable Part of them, which I send herewith. Her Complement was Eighty Men, but from manning Prizes off Mozambique last Cruise, are reduced to Thirty at this Time.
