It is but just that I should take Notice of the Exertions of Mr. J. Acott (acting) Master, who has passed for Lieutenant, whom I left in Charge of the Ship, and who proved himfelf worthy of the Confidence reposed in him. The Topaze French Frigate appeared in the Offing on the 13th, with a Reinforcement for the Garrison, though with only Twenty-five Englishmen and Twenty Negroes, and no other Officers than Two young Gentlemen, Messe George Yeo and Edward Bryant, he contrived by his skilful Manœuvres to drive her off the Coaft.

As to the Seamen and Marines, all Praife I can beftow falls fhort of their Merit; from the 15th December they never flept in their Beds; the Weather was conftantly both boifterous and rainy; the Roads almost impassable; and from the Time we landed until the Surrender of the Place they had not the least Ceffation from Fatigue.

I have the Honour to inclose a Statement of the Killed and Wounded on board the Confiance (Twenty-four); also a Lift of the Returns of Ordnance, Stores, &c. The Portuguese Land and Sea Forces, One killed and Eight wounded; French, One Captain and Fifteen Privates killed, and Twenty wounded.

I have now, Sir, the Happinels to congratulate you on the final Succels of the Expedition, and I truft the Steps I have taken will infure me your Approbation.

CAPITULATION, propoled by Victor Hugues, Officer of the Legion of Honour, Commander of His Mojefty the Emperor and King, Commander in Chief of Cayenne and French Guyana, and accepted by James Lucas Yeo, Polt Captain in His Britannic Majefty's Scrwice, commanding the Combined Naval Englif. and Portuguese Forces, and Manuel Marques, Knight of the Military Order of Saint Benvit a' Avie, Licutenant-Colonel in Chief and Director of the Corps of Artillery of Para, commanding the advanced Army of the Portuguese.

ALTHOUGH the advanced Pofts have been carried, and that the Commiffioner of the Emperor and King is reduced with his Garrifon to the Town, the owes it to those Sentiments of Honour which have always diffinguifhed him, to the Valour and good Conduct of the Officers and Soldiers under his Command, to the Attachment of the Inhabitants of the Colony for His Majefty the Emperor and King, to declare publicly, that he furrenders lefs to the Force than to the defructive System of liberating all the Slaves who fhould join the Enemy, and of burning all the Plantations and Ports where there should be any Refutance.

The Commiffioner of the Emperor commanding in Chief, after having witneffed the burning of feveral Plautations, particularly his own, the most confiderable of the Colony, had attributed it at first to the Cafualties of War, and the Diforganization of the Gangs, and the Liberation of the Slaves appeared to him a momentary Nuifance; but being aflared in Writing that the English and Portuguese Officers acted in virtue of the Orders of His Roval Highnefs whe Prince Regent, and in withing to fave the Colo-

ny from total Deflruction, and to preferve his august Master's Subjects, who had given him fo many Proofs of their Attachment and Fidelity, the Commissioner of His Imperial and Royal Majesty furrenders the Colony to the Forces of His Royal Highnefs the Prince Regent on the following Conditions:

Article I. The Garrifon shall march out with their Arms and Baggage, and all the Honours of War; the Officers shall retain their Side Arms, and those of the Staff their Horses. The Garrifon shall lay down their Arms, and engage not to serve against His Royal Highness and His Allies during one Year.

11. Véffels shall be furnished at the Expence of His Highness the Prince Regent, to carry the Garrison, the Officers Civil and Military, and all those employed in the Service, with their Families and Effects, direct to France with as little Delay as posfible.

III. A convenient Veffel shall be furnished to convey to France the Commissioner of the Emperor commanding in Chief, his Family, his Officers, his Suite, and Effects, the Chief of the Administration of Finances, the Commander of the Troops, the Inspector, and the Commandant of the Artillery, with their Families

IV. A convenient Delay shall be granted to the Officers who have Property in the Colony to settle their Affairs.

their Affairs V. The Arfenals, Batteries, and every Thing belonging to the Artillery, the fmall Arms and Powder Magazines, and the Provision Stores. fhall be given up by Inventory, and in the State in which they now are, and the fame shall be pointed out.

VI. The Slaves on both Sides shall be difarmed and fent to their respective Plantations. The French Negroes whom the Commanders by Sea and Land of this Royal Highness the Prince Regent have engaged for the Service during the War, and to whom, in virtue of their Orders, they have given their Freedom, shall be fent out of the Colony, as they can only remain there in future an Object of Trouble and Diffusion. The Commanders engage, as they have promifed, to folicit of His Royal Highness the. Prince Regent the replacing of those Slaves, or an Indemnity in favour of the Inhabitants to whom they belong.

VII. The Papers, Plans, and other Articles belonging to the Engineer Department, fhall be equally given up.

VIII. The Sick and Wounded who are obliged to remain in the Colony may leave it, with all that belongs to them, as foon as they are in a Situation to do fo; in the mean Time they shall be treated as they have been hitherto.

IX. Private Property, of whatfoever Nature or Defeription, fhall be respected, and the Inhabitants may dispose of it as heretofore.

X. The Inhabitants of the Colony shall preferve their Properties, and refide there, conforming to the Orders and Forms effablished by the Sovereign under which they remain; they shall be at Liberty to fell their Properties and retire wherever it may fuit. them, without any Obstacle.

XI. The Civil Laws, known in France under the Title of the Napolean Code, and in Force in the Colony, fhall be observed and executed until the Peace between the Two Nations; the Magilirates
