shall only decide on the Interests of Individuals and Differences connected with them in virtue of the faid Laws

XII. The Debts acknowledged by Individuals during or previous to the Time fixed by the preceding Article, fhall be exacted agreeably to the Bafis determined by the fame Article.

XIII. The Papers concerning the Controul and Matriculation of the Troops shall be carried away by the Quarter-Master.

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XIV. Defirous of preferving the Spice Plantation called La Gabrielle in all its Splendour and Agriculture, it is flipulated that neither it nor any of the Plantation Trees or Plants shall be destroyed, but that it shall be preferved in the State in which it is given up to the Commanders of His Royal Highnels the Prince Regent.

XV. All the Papers of the Stores, of Infpection, of the Cufloms, or of any Refponfibility whatever, fhall be deposited in the Secretaries' Office, or in any other Place that may be agreed on to be referred to when there is Occasion: the Whole shall be under the Seal of the Two Governments, and at the Disposal of His Imperial and Royal Majesty.

XVI. The prefent Capitulation shall be written in the Three Languages, and figned by the Three Officers stipulating.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Young, Commander in Chief at Plymouth, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated the 13th Inflant.

SIR,

HAVE great Pleafure in transmitting, for the Information of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter from Captain Seymour, of His Majeity's Ship Amethyft, to Admiral Lord Gambier, giving his Lordship an Account of the Amethyft having taken another of the Enemy's Frigates. I am, &c. W. YOUNG.

My LORD, Amethyfl, off Ufhant, April 12, 1809. I HAVE very fincere Pleafere in acquainting you of the Capture of Le Niemen, a fine new French Frigate of Forty-four Guns, Twenty-eight of which are Eighteen Pounders on the main Deck, and Three Hundred and Nineteen Men, Copper fastened, Two Days from Verdun Roads, with Six Months Provisions and Naval Stores on board, and bound to the Isle of France, commanded by Monf. Dupotet, Capitaine de Frigate, a diffinguished Officer, who defended his Ship with great Ability and Resolution.

At Eleven in the Forenoon of the 5th Inflant, the Wind at Eaft, Emerald North within Signal Diftance, Cordovan bearing E. by N. 42 Leagues, a Ship was perceived in the E. S. E. coming down, fleering to the Weftward; which hauled to the S. S. E. on making us out. She was immediately chaced, but at Twenty Minutes paft Seven we loft Sight of her and the Emerald, and had not gained on the Chace.

After Dark the Amethylt's Courfe was fhaped to meet the probable Route of an Enemy, which, at Half path Nine, we croffed One, but though within Half Gun-Shot at Eleven, from which Time till One the Bow and the Stern Chafers were exchanging, her extraordinary failing prevented our effecting any Thing ferious. From One till paft Three A. M. on the 6th, the Action was fevere, after which the Enemy's Main and Mizenmafts fell, his Fire became faint, was juft filenced, while ours continued as lively as ever, when the Arethufa appeared, and on her firing, he immediately made a Signal of having furrendered, and proved to be the fame Frigate recommended to my Notice in your Lordfhip's Order of the 9th Ultimo. She fell on board us once in the Conteft; fhe had Forty feven killed and Seventy-three wounded. The Main and Mizenmatts of the Amethylt fell at the Clofe of the Action, and fhe had Eight killed and Thirtyfeven wounded.

To render just Praife to the brave and admirable Conduct of every Officer and Man of this Ship's Company (of whom 1 wo Officers and Thirty-leven Men were abfent in Prizes, the Prifoners' from which, Sixty-nine, were on board), I am perfectly unequal. The great Exertions and Experience of the Firft Lieutenant, Mr. William Hill, and Mr. Robert Fair, the Maller, I am particularly indebted for. Lieutenants Waring and Prytherch, of the Royal Marines, deferve my beit Thanks.

The Prize's Foremait fell next Day, and I left her in tow of the Arethnia, who afforded us in every Inftance the most prompt Affistance, and by Captain Mend's Defire I write.
