The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, was pleased, for the Reasons assigned therein, to order that "all the Ports and Places of France and her Allies, or of any other Country at War with His Majesty, and all other Ports or Places in Europe from which, although not at War with His Majesty, the British Flag is excluded, and all Ports or Places in the Colonies belonging to His Majesty's Enemies, should from thenceforth be subject to the same Restrictions in point of Trade and Navigation, as if the same were actually blockaded in the most strict and rigorous Manner;" and also to prohibit, "all Trade in Articles which are the Produce or Manufacture of the said Countries or Colonies;" And whereas His Majesty having been nevertheless desirous not to subject those Countries which were in Alliance or in Amity with His Majesty to any greater Inconvenience than was absolutely inseparable from carrying into Effect His Majesty's just Determination to counteract the Designs of His Enemies, did make certain Exceptions and Modifications expressed in the said Order of the Eleventh of November, and in certain subsequent Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November, declaratory of the aforesaid Order of the Eleventh of November and the Eighteenth of December One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Thirtieth of March One thousand eight hundred and eight:

And whereas, in consequence of divers Events which have taken place since the Date of the first-mentioned Order affecting the Relation between Great Britain and the Territories of other Powers, it is expedient that sundry Parts and Provisions of the said Orders should be altered or revoked:

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke and annul the said several Orders, except as hereinafter expressed, and so much of the said several Orders, except as aforesaid, is hereby revoked accordingly.

And His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all the Ports and Places, as far North as the River Ems inclusively, under the Government styling itself the Kingdom of Holland, and all Ports and Places under the Government of France, together with the Colonies, Plantations, and Settlements in the Possession of those Governments respectively, and all Ports and Places in the Northern Parts of Italy, to be reckoned from the Ports of Orbitello and Pesaro inclusively, shall continue and be subject to the same Restrictions, in point of Trade and Navigation, without any Exception, as if the same were actually blockaded by His Majesty's Naval Forces in the most strict and rigorous Manner; and that every Vessel trading from and to the said Countries or Colonies, Plantations or Settlements, together with all Goods and Merchandise on board, shall be condemned as Prize to the Captors.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Order shall have Effect from the Day of the Date thereof, with Respect to any Ship, together with its Cargo, which may be captured subsequent to such Day on any Voyage which is and shall be rendered legal by this Order, although such Voyage at the Time of the Commencement of the same was unlawful and prohibited under the said former Orders; and such Ships, upon being brought in, shall be released accordingly; and with Respect to all Ships, together with their Car-goes, which may be captured in any Voyage which was permitted under the Exceptions of the Orders above mentioned, but which is not permitted according to the Provisions of this Order, His Majesty is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

that such Ships, and their Cargoes, shall not be liable to Condemnation, unless they shall have received actual Notice of the present Order before such Capture; or in Default of such Notice, until after the Expiration of the like Intervals from the Date of this Order, as were allowed for constructive Notice in the Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Eighteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and eight, at the several Places and Latitudes therein specified.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Then, by His Majesty's Command, Sir David Baird was introduced into the Presence between Sir Eyre Coote and Sir David Dundas, the Two Junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order, with due Reverences; and (having been previously knighted by Patent bearing Date the 19th of June 1804) the Ribbon and Badge were presented to the Sovereign by His Royal Highness the Duke of York; and, Sir David Baird kneeling, His Majesty put the same over his Right Shoulder: being thus invested, Sir David had the Honour to kiss the Sovereign's Hand, and withdrew.

Then Major-General Brent Spencer, and Thomas Lord Cochrane, were severally introduced, knighted, and invested, with like Ceremonies: whereupon the Procession returned in the Order before observed.

An Act for continuing and making perpetual several Duties of One Shilling and Six Pence, repealed by an Act of the last Session of Parliament, on Offices and Employments of Profit, and on Au-

nities, Pensions, and Stipends, and thereby granted for One Year, to the 25th Day of March 1809.

An Act for the Appropriation of Twenty Thousand Pounds out of the Consolidated Fund of Ireland towards the Encouragement of the Saving of Flax Seed for sowing in Ireland

An Act for the more convenient Payment of Pensions to Widows of Officers of the Navy.

An Act to continue, until the 25th Day of March 1810, an Act of the Forty-first Year of His present Majesty, for prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland, and for permitting the Importation into Ireland Duty free, of Corn and other Provisions.

An Act to grant an Excise Duty on Spirits made or distilled from Sugar in Ireland, during the Prohibition of Distillation from Corn or Grain there, in lieu of the Excise Duty now chargeable thereon; and to allow a Drawback on the Export thereof to Foreign Parts.

Extract of a Letter from Admiral Lord Gambier, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels employed in the Channel Soundings, &c. to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board the Caledonia, in Basque Roads, the 16th Instant.

IT has blown violently from the Southward and Westward since the Departure of the Imperieuse, which has rendered it impracticable to act in any way with the small Vessels or Boats of the Fleet against the Enemy.

I have the Satisfaction to observe this Morning, that the Enemy have set Fire to their Frigate (L'Indienne); and that the Ship of the Line, which is aground at the Entrance of the River, (supposed to be the Regulus,) there is every Reason to believe will be wrecked.

Copy of another Letter from Admiral Lord Gambier to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board the Caledonia, in Basque Roads, the 15th Instant.

SIR,

BE pleased to lay before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the inclosed Letter which I have this Day received from Captain Mends, of His Majesty's Ship Arethusa, detailing Particulars of the Destruction of Three different Batteries (one of Twenty heavy Guns) at Lequito and other Places on the North Coast of Spain, by Boats from that Ship; and of their active Annoyance of the Enemy in attempting to send Supplies to their Army along that Coast.

His Majesty's Ship Arethusa, off Bilbao, 20th March 1809.

SIR,

I HAVE the Pleasure of acquainting you, for the Commander in Chief's Information, that on the 17th Instant, at Daybreak in the Morning, a Party of Seamen and Marines belonging to this Ship were landed under the Command of the First Lieutenant, Mr. Hugh Pearson, and Lieutenant Scott of the Marines, and destroyed upwards of Twenty heavy Guns mounted on the Batteries at Lequito, defended

by a Detachment of French Soldiers, a Serjeant and Twenty of whom were made Prisoners, who, on our People forcing the Guard-House in the principal Battery, threw down their Arms, and begged for Quarter; the rest of their Comrades effected their Escape by running for it.

This little Affair was conducted by Lieutenant Pearson with that Boldness and Promptitude which generally commands Success, to which I attribute our having only Three Men wounded, notwithstanding a quick Fire of Musketry for some Time from the Battery and Guard-House as our People advanced. A small Chaloupe, laden with Brandy, was found in the Harbour and brought away.

The following Day, having received Information of Two Chasse Mares being up River Andaro, laden with Brandy for the French Army in Spain, in the Evening the same Party was again lauded, who found them aground, about Four Miles up, with their Cargoes on board, which were destroyed; but the Vessels appearing to be Spanish Property, and forcibly seized on to carry those Supplies, were restored to their Owners.

On the 20th Lieutenant Elms Steele, with a Party, destroyed the Guns at Baignio, and captured a small Vessel laden with Marino Wool, which had run in there for Security, from St. Andero bound to Bayonne; whilst Lieutenant Fennel, of the Marines, accompanied by Mr. Elliott, the Purser, and a Boat's Crew, ascended the Mountain and destroyed the Signal Posts.

The same Evening Lieutenant Pearson, with the Officers and Men who were with him at Laquito, took Possession of the Batteries at the Town of Paisance without Opposition, and destroyed the Guns; the small Parties of the Enemy stationed at these Places retiring as our People approached.

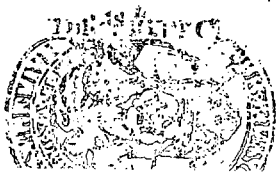

Copy of a Letter from the Honourable George Elliot, Captain of His Majesty's Ship the Modeste, to Vice-Admiral Sir Edward Pellew, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the East Indies, and transmitted by the latter to the Honourable William Wellesley Pole.

SIR, *Modeste, off Sandhead, Oct. 9, 1808.*

I HAVE great Satisfaction in acquainting your Excellency of His Majesty's Ship Modeste, under my Command, having last Night captured La Jena, French National Corvette, pierced for Twenty-four Guns, but only Eighteen on board, and Complement One Hundred and Fifty Men, commanded by Monf. Morice, Lieutenant de Vaisseau, after a Chase of Nine Hours, and a running Action of nearly One Hour, (from it being but a light Breeze, which enabled her to keep her Distance with her Sweeps,) when she struck, a complete Wreck in her Sails and Rigging; she had cut away her Boats and Booms, and thrown Three Guns overboard, in the Chase. We received no Damage to signify, but the Loss of Mr. William Donovan (the Master), a very valuable and gallant Officer, unfortunately killed, and One Seaman wounded. La Jena has not received any material Damage in



her Hull; she sails well, and appears a very fit Vessel for His Majesty's Service. She had been Four Months from the Isle of France, and taken the *Jennet of Madras*, and the *Swallow of Penang*; the first she sunk, the latter was in Sight during the Chace, but sailing very well, got out of Sight to Leeward before *La Jena* was taken, and we have not been fortunate enough to see her since.

And whereas by a certain other Act of Parliament, passed in the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, intituled "An Act to alter and amend an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for improving and rendering more commodious the Port and Harbour of Bristol, and for extending the Powers and Provisions of the said Act," Authority was given to the said Dock Company, as well to vary and alter certain of the Works by the said recited Act directed to be made, and also to form, complete, and maintain a certain Road for Horses, Carts, Carriages, and Foot Passengers, in the said reciting Act particularly described:

And whereas by a certain other Act of Parliament, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, intituled "An Act for completing the Improvement of the Port of Bristol," the said Dock Company were authorized and empowered to make certain Alterations in the Works by the said recited Acts directed to be made, and also to erect and form certain other additional Works in the said last-mentioned Act particularly men-

"That in case all the several Works authorized to be made by the said recited Acts and that Act, save and except the Towing-Path authorized and required to be formed between Hanham Mills and the Engine Mill, the Alterations required to be made in the Lock at Hanham, and the Works required to be executed for the Protection of the Estates of the Dukes of Chandos and William Gore Langton, Esq; should not be completed and finished, and the Completion thereof duly proved before the Justices of the Peace in and for the City and County of Bristol, in Quarter Sessions assembled, and certified by Writing under the Hand of the proper Officer of the Court, and a Copy of such Certificate inserted in the London Gazette, and Two or more of the Bristol Newspapers, on or before the 1st Day of May 1809, then and in such Case the Rates and Duties imposed by the said recited Acts should cease, and be no longer paid or payable, until the Expiration of Three Calendar Months after the said Works should have been so completed and finished, and certified and advertised as hereinbefore directed; and from and after the Expiration of Three Calendar Months after the said Works should have been completed and finished, and certified and advertised as aforesaid, All and singular the Rates and Duties imposed and made payable by the said recited Acts, and not thereby altered, varied, or repealed, should recommence, and be again paid and payable, until the same be again redeemed in Manner in the said recited Acts and that Act declared."

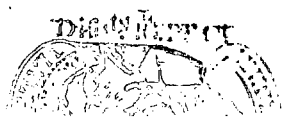

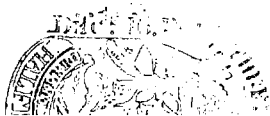
