A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 26th of April 1809,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majelty, by His Order in Council of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, was pleased, for the Reasons assigned therein, to order that " all the Ports and Places of France and her Allies, or of any other Country at War with His Majesty, and all other Ports or Places in Europe from which, although not at War with His Majesty, the British Flag is excluded, and all Ports or Places in the Colonies belonging to His Majelly's Enemies, should from thenceforth be subject to the same Redrictions in point of Trade and Navigation, as if the same were actually blockaded in the most strict and rigorous Manner;" and also to prohibit," all Trade in Articles which are the Produce or Manufacture of the faid Countries or Colonies:" And whereas His Majesty having been nevertheless desirous not to subject those Countries which were in Alliance or in Amity with His Majelly to any greater Inconvenience than was absolutely inseparable from carrying into Effect His Majelly's just Determination to counteract the Deligns of His Enemies, did make certain Exceptious and Modifications expressed in the faid Order of the Eleventh of November, and in certain subsequent Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November, declaratory of the aforesaid Order of the Eleventh of November and the Eighteenth of December One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Thirtieth of March One thousand eight hundred and eight:

And whereas, in confequence of divers Events which have taken place fince the Date of the first-mentioned Order affecting the Relation between Great Britain and the Territories of other Powers, it is expedient that Jundry Parts and Provisions of the Iaid Orders hould be altered oprevoked:

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke and annul the said several Orders, except as hereinaster expressed, and so much of the said several Orders, except as aforesaid, is hereby revoked accordingly.

And His Majelly is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all the Ports and Places, as far North as the River Ems inclusively, under the Government stiling itself the Kingdom of Holland, and all Ports and Places under the Government of France, together with the Colonies, Plantations, and Settlements in the Pollession of those Governments respectively, and all Ports and Places in the Northern Parts of Italy, to be reckoned from the Ports of Orbitello and Pelaro inclusively, shall continue and be subject to the same Restrictions, in point of Trade and Navigation, without any Exception, as if the same were actually blockaded by His Majesty's Naval Forces in the most strict and rigorous Manner; and that every Veffel trading from and to the faid Countries or Colonies, Plantations or Settlements, together with all Goods and Merchandise on board, shall be condemned as Prize to the Captors.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Order shall have Effect from the Day of the Date thereof, with Respect to any Ship, together with its Cargo, which may be captured subsequent to such Day on any Voyage which is and shall be rendered legal by this Order, although such Voyage at the Time of the Commencement of the same was unlawful and prohibited under the faid former Orders; and fuch Ships, upon being brought in, shall be releated accordingly; and with Respect to all Ships, together with their Cargoes, which may be captured in any Voyage which was permitted under the Exceptions of the Orders above mentioned, but which is not permitted according to the Provisions of this Order, His Maicfly is pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered,

that such Ships, and their Cargoes, shall not be liable to Condemnation, unless they shall have received actual Notice of the prefent Order before fuch Capture; or in Default of fuch Notice, until after the Expiration of the like Intervals from the Date of this Order, as were allowed for conftructive Notice in the Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Eighteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and eight, at the feveral Places and Latitudes therein specified.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commilfioners of His Majelly's Treasury, His Majelly's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiftioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Queen's Palace, Wednesday, April 26, 1809 CEREMONIAL of the Investiture of Lieutenant-General Sir David Baird, and of the Knighthood and Investiture of Lieutenant-General the Honourable Sir John Hope, Major-General Sir Brent Spincer, and Sir Thomas Cochrane, commonly called the Right Honourable Lord Cochrane (eldest Son and Heir Apparent of Archibald Earl of Dundonali), a Captain in the Royal Navy, Knights of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath.

THE Knights and Officers of the Order attending in their Mantles, Collars, &c. proceeded into the Sovereign's Presence, making the usual Reverences, in the following Order:

The Gentleman Usher of the Order, in his Mantle, Chain, and Badge, bearing the Red Rod.

The Deputy Regilter and Secretary of the Order, in the Mantle, Chains, and Badges of that Officer.

Deputy Bath King of Arms, in the Mantle, Chain, and Badge, with the Sceptre, of Bath, bearing the Ribbons and Badges of the Order upon a Crimfon Velvet Cushion.

The Genealogist, in his Mantle, Chain, and Badge.

KNIGHTS COMPANIONS. Right Honourable Sir David Dundas. Sir Eyre Coote.

Sir Thomas Trigge. Sir John Colpoys. Sir Alured Clarke. Lord Keith.

The Dean of Westminster, Dean of the Order, in his Mantle, Chain, and Badge.

His Royal Highness the Duke of York and Albany, First and Principal Companion.

Then, by His Majelly's Command, Sir David Baird was introduced into the Presence between Sir Eyre Coote and Sir David Dundas, the Two Junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Gentleman Uther of the Order, with due Reverences; and (having been previously knighted by Patent bearing Date the 19th of June 1804) the Ribbon and Badge were prefented to the Sovereign by His Royal Highness the Duke of York; and, Sir David Baird kneeling, His Majesty put the same over his Right Shoulder: being thus invested, Sir David had the Honour' to kils the Sovereign's Hand, and withdrew.

Then, by His Majelty's Command, Lieutenant-General the Honomable John Hope was introduced into the Presence between the faid Two Junior Knights Companions, preceded by the Gentleman Ufher; and the Sword of State having been delivered to the Sovereign by Lord Keith, the fecond Knight in Seniority present, Lieutenant-General Hope, kneeling, was knighted therewith. His Royal Highnels the Duke of York then prefented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put the same over the Right Shoulder of the new Knight, who, being thus invelted had the Honour to kifs the Sovereign's Hand, and withdrew. Then Major-General Brent Spencer, and Thomas

Lord Cochrane, were feverally introduced, knighted, and invelted, with like Ceremonies: whereupon the Procession returned in the Order before observed.

Extract of a Letter from Admiral Lord Gambier, Commander in Chief of His Majefty's Ships and Veffels employed in the Channel Soundings, Sc. to the Hon. IV. IV. Pole, dated on board the Caledonia, in Bafque Roads, the 16th Inflant.

Thas blown violently from the Southward and Wellward fince the Departure of the Impericule, which has rendered it impracticable to act in any way with the small Vessels or Boats of the Fleet

against the Enemy.

I have the Satisfaction to observe this Morning, that the Enemy have set Fire to their Frigate (L'Indienne); and that the Ship of the Line, which is aground at the Entrance of the River, (supposed to be the Regulus,) there is every Reason to believe will be wrecked.

SIR,

E pleased to lay before the Lords Commissioners

of the Admiralty the inclosed Letter which I
have this Day received from Captain Mends, of His
Majesty's Ship Arethusa, detailing Particulars of
the Destruction of Three different Batteries (one of
Twenty heavy Guns) at Lequito and other Places
on the North Coast of Spain, by Boats from that
Ship; and of their active Annoyance of the Enemy
in attempting to send Supplies to their Army along
that Coast.

the Commander in Chief's Information, that on the active and Lieutenant, at Daybreak in the Morning, a Party of Seamen and Maxines belonging to this Ship were landed under the Command of the First Lieutenant, Mr. Hugh Pearson, and Lieutenant Scott of the Marines, and delivoyed upwards of Twenty heavy Cues mounted on the Batteries at Lequito, defended La Jena has not received any material Damage in

by a Detachment of French Soldiers, a Serjeant and Twenty of whom were made Prisoners, who, on our People forcing the Guard-House in the principal Battery, threw down their Arms, and begged for Quarter; the rest of their Comrades effected their Escape by running for it.

This little Affair was conducted by Lieutenant Pearson with that Boldness and Promptitude which generally commands Success, to which I attribute our having only Three Men wounded, notwithstanding a quick Fire of Musketry for some Time from the Battery and Guard-House as our People advanced. A small Chaloupe, laden with Brandy, was found in the Harbour and brought away.

The following Day, having received Information of Two Chaffe Marces being up River Andaro, laden with Brandy for the French Army in Spain, in the Evening the fame Party was again lauded, who found them aground, about Four Miles up, with their Cargoes on board, which were destroyed; but the Vessels appearing to be Spanish Property, and forcibly seized on to carry those Supplies, were restored to their Owners.

On the 20th Lieutenant Elms Steele, with a Party, destroyed the Guns at Baignio, and captured a small Vessel laden with Marino Wool, which had run in there for Security, from St. Andero bound to Bayonne; whilst Lieutenant Fennel, of the Marines, accompanied by Mr. Elliott, the Purses, and a Boat's Crew, ascended the Mountain and destroyed the Signal Posts.

The same Evening Lieutenant Pearson, with the Officers and Men who were with him at Laquito, took Possession of the Batteries at the Town of Paisance without Opposition, and destroyed the Guns; the small Parties of the Enemy stationed at these

Places retiring as our People approached.

Copy of a Letter from the Honourable George Elliot, Captain of His Majefly's Ship the Modefle, to Vice-Admiral Sir Edward Pellew, Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffe's in the East Indies, and transmitted by the latter to the Honourable William Wellefley Pole.

SIR, Modeste, off Sandstead, Oct. 9, 1808. I HAVE great Satisfaction in acquainting your Excellency of His Majetty's Ship Modeste, under my Command, having last Night captured La Jena, French National Corvette, pierced for Twenty-sour Guns, but only Eighteen on board, and Complement One Hundred and Fifty Men, commanded by Mons. Morice, Lieutenant de Vaisseau, after a Chace of Nine Hours, and a running Action of nearly One Hour, (from it being but a light Breeze, which enabled her to keep her Distance with her Sweeps,) when she struck, a complete Wreck in her Sails and Rigging; she had cut away her Boats and Booms, and thrown Three Guns overboard, in the Chace. We received no Damage to signify, but the Loss of Mr. William Donovan (the Master), a very valuable and gallant Officer, unfortunately killed, and One Seaman wounded. La Jena has not received any material Damage in
