AT the Council-Chamber *Whitehall*, the 29th of April 1809,

P R E S E N T,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council, bearing Date the Eighteenth of this instant April, it was, among other Things, directed that all Ships and Vessels coming from or having touched at the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona, or any other Port of Sweden, should come to Anchor at such Place and Places as should be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order that the State of Health of the Crew and Persons on board such Ships and Vessels should be duly examined into and ascertained prior to such Ships and Vessels being permitted to enter their Ports of Destination; and that in certain Cases mentioned in the said Order, all such Ships and Vessels, with their Cargoes and Persons on board, should perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days: And whereas it has been represented to this Board, that the Fever of a contagious Description, which had prevailed in the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona during some Part of the last Winter, had never manifested itself at Gottenburgh or other Ports of Sweden, except the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona, it is hereby ordered in Council, that the Precautions and Regulations contained in the said Order in Council, bearing Date the Eighteenth of this instant, be revoked (and they are hereby revoked) so far as respects all Ships and Vessels which are arrived, or may arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, from any of the Ports of Sweden, except from the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque

Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

AT the Council-Chamber *Whitehall*, the 18th of April 1809,

P R E S E N T,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine," it is among other Things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, to make such Order as they shall see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen Emergency, or in any particular Case or Cases with respect to any Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels arriving and having any infectious Disease or Distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious Disease or Distemper may have appeared in the Course of the Voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious Circumstances as to Infection, although such Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels shall not have come from any Place or Places from which His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague, or any such infectious Disease or Distemper may be brought, and also with respect to the Persons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize on board the same; and all such Orders so made by the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any Three or more of them as aforesaid, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes (as well with respect to the Commander, Master, or other Person having the Charge of any such Ship or Vessel, and all other Persons on board the same, as with respect to any other Persons having any Intercourse or Communication with them,

and to the Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments to which they may respectively become liable) as any Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection as aforesaid, and notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette :

And whereas Advices have been received, that a dangerous Fever of a very contagious Description has prevailed in the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona, and particularly the latter, and has raged with the most fatal Violence during even the Severity of the Winter ; and as there must have been some Danger of the same having spread throughout the Kingdom of Sweden, it is hereby ordered in Council, That all Ships and Vessels coming from or having touched at the Ports of Stockholm or Carlscrona, or any other Port in Sweden, or having received any Person or Persons, Goods, Wares or Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, from out of any such Ship or Vessel, shall, on their Arrival on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark and Man, come to Anchor at such Place and Places as have been or shall be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, within or without the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall be bound, in order that the State of Health of the Crew and Persons on board may be duly examined into and ascertained, prior to such Ships and Vessels being permitted to enter the Port of their Destination ; and that in the mean Time, no Intercourse with any other Ship or Vessel, or Boat, or with the Shore, shall be permitted, nor any of the Crew or Persons on board such Ships or Vessels be suffered to come or be brought on Shore :

And it is hereby further Ordered, That in case upon such Examination it shall appear to the Superintendant or other Principal Officer of the Customs employed in the Quarantine Service, that such Ships or Vessels have the same contagious Fever actually on board, or that any of the Crew or Persons on board have been ill or have died of such contagious Fever within the Space of Forty Days prior to the Arrival of such Ships or Vessels on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Islands aforesaid, or that in the Event of any Death occasioned by such contagious Fever having taken Place on board at an earlier Period of the Voyage than Forty Days prior to their Arrival on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Islands aforesaid, the Clothes and Bedding, and all Personal Effects susceptible of Infection worn by or belonging to the Persons so deceased were not thrown overboard and sunk immediately upon such Decease, or as soon after as possible ; or in case it shall appear that such Ships had within the Space of Forty Days, prior to Arrival on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Islands aforesaid, received any Person or Persons, or any of the Articles hereinbefore mentioned, from out of any Ship, Vessel or Boat coming from the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona, or any other Port in Sweden, then and in such Case every such Ship and Vessel, with their Cargoes and Persons on board, shall perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days (or of such further Time as may be afterwards directed by any Order or Orders of Three

of more of the Lords or others of His Majesty's Privy Council) at the several Places appointed for the Performance of Quarantine by Ships subject and liable thereto, and bound to the said several Ports respectively :

And it is hereby further ordered, That notwithstanding the Ships and Vessels arriving or to arrive importing the same, and sent to the usual Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and be there opened and aired for the Space of Fifteen Days, as directed by His Majesty's said Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, Sec. 13. with respect to Goods, Wares and Merchandizes coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General, and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by sundry Acts of Parliament, His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 5th of October last, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of certain Articles of Provision, in the Manner and under the Conditions therein mentioned ; and whereas by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty, intituled " An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation, and to permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament," which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, shall, from and after the said Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, be, and the same is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and ten, except so far as respects the Exportation of Corn, Grain, or Flour to Ireland ; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and ten, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and

all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Soar Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be imported with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said above-recited Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. *Steph. P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, was pleased, for the Reasons assigned therein, to order that "all the Ports and Places of France and her Allies, or of any other Country at War with His Majesty, and all other Ports or Places in Europe from which, although not at War with His Majesty, the British Flag is excluded, and all Ports or Places in the Colonies belonging to His Majesty's Enemies, should from thenceforth be subject to the same Restrictions in point of Trade and Navigation, as if the same were actually blockaded in the most strict and rigorous Manner;" and also to prohibit "all Trade in Articles which are the Produce or Manufacture of the said Countries or Colonies:" And whereas His Majesty having been nevertheless desirous not to subject those Countries which were in Alliance or in Amity with His Majesty to any greater Inconvenience than was absolutely inseparable from carrying into Effect His Majesty's just Determination to counteract the Designs of His Enemies, did make certain Exceptions and Modifications expressed in the said Order of the Eleventh of November, and in certain subsequent Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November, declaratory of the aforesaid Order of the Eleventh of November and the Eighteenth of December One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Thirtieth of March One thousand eight hundred and eight:

And whereas, in consequence of divers Events which have taken place since the Date of the first-mentioned Order affecting the Relation between Great Britain and the Territories of other Powers, it is expedient that sundry Parts and Provisions of the said Orders should be altered or revoked:

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke and annul the said several Orders, except as hereinafter expressed, and so much of the said several Orders,

except as aforesaid, is hereby revoked accordingly.

And His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all the Ports and Places, as far North as the River Ems inclusively, under the Government styling itself the Kingdom of Holland, and all Ports and Places under the Government of France, together with the Colonies, Plantations, and Settlements in the Possession of those Governments respectively, and all Ports and Places in the Northern Parts of Italy, to be reckoned from the Ports of Orbitello and Pesaro inclusively, shall continue and be subject to the same Restrictions, in point of Trade and Navigation, without any Exception, as if the same were actually blockaded by His Majesty's Naval Forces in the most strict and rigorous Manner; and that every Vessel trading from and to the said Countries or Colonies, Plantations or Settlements, together with all Goods and Merchandise on board, shall be condemned as Prize to the Captors.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Order shall have Effect from the Day of the Date thereof, with Respect to any Ship, together with its Cargo, which may be captured subsequent to such Day on any Voyage which is and shall be rendered legal by this Order, although such Voyage at the Time of the Commencement of the same was unlawful and prohibited under the said former Orders; and such Ships, upon being brought in, shall be released accordingly; and with Respect to all Ships, together with their Cargoes, which may be captured in any Voyage which was permitted under the Exceptions of the Orders above mentioned, but which is not permitted according to the Provisions of this Order, His Majesty is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that such Ships, and their Cargoes, shall not be liable to Condemnation, unless they shall have received actual Notice of the present Order before such Capture; or in Default of such Notice, until after the Expiration of the like Intervals from the Date of this Order, as were allowed for constructive Notice in the Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Eighteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and eight, at the several Places and Latitudes therein specified.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
