T the Council-Chamber Whitehall, the 29th of April 1809,

PRESENT,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council, bearing Date the Eighteenth of this instant April. it was, among other Things, directed that all Ships and Veffels coming from or having touched at the Ports of Stockholm and Carlferona, or any other Port of Sweden, should come to Anchor at such Place and Places as should be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order that the State of Health of the Crew and Persons on board fuch Ships and Vessels should be duly examined into and afcertained prior to fuch Ships and Vessels being permitted to enter their Ports of Deflination; and that in certain Cases mentioned in the faid Order, all fuch Ships and Vessels, with their Cargoes and Persons on board, should personn a Quarantine of Fifteen Days: And whereas it has been represented to this Board, that the Fever of a contagious Description, which had prevailed in the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona during some Part of the last Winter, had never manifested itself at Gottenburgh or other Ports of Sweden, except the Ports of Stockholm and Carlfcrona, it is hereby ordered in Council, that the Precautions and Regulations contained in the faid Order in Council, bearing Date the Eighteenth of this instant, be revoked (and they are hereby revoked) so far as respects all Ships and Vessels which are arrived, or may arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, from any of the Ports of Sweden, except from the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commis-fioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may Steph. Gettrell. respectively appertain.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral the Right Ho-nourable Lord Collingwood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Medi-terranean, to the Honourable W. W. Pole, dated on board the Ocean, the 15th March 1809.

HAVE the Pleasure to inclose to you, to be laid before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Letter of Captain Brisbane, of His Majesty's Ship Belle Poule, informing me of his having fallen in with, and captured, the French Frigate Le Var, in the Gulph of Valona.

Also a Letter from Captain Hoste, of His Majesty's Ship the Amphion, stating his having captured a French Armed Brig, mounting Six Guns, and a Trabacculo, which were employed in transporting Troops from Zara to the Coast of Italy.

The unremitting Vigilance of those Officers, and of all who are employed in the Adriatic and off Corfu, is deserving of the highest Commendation. Their strick Watch on the Enemy's Possessions has reduced the Ionian Islands to the greatest Want of every Necessary, most of the Supplies from the Continent having been intercepted by them; and the Frigate captured by the Belle Poule, I under-ftand, was on her Way to some Port in Italy for a Cargo of Corn. My Lord, I HAVE the Honour to report to your Lordfhip, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command being driven by a hard foutherly Gale about Twelve Leagues to the Northward of Corfu, a suspicious Ship was discovered on the Morning of the 14th Instant, far distant on the Lee Bow. All Sail was

instantly made in Pursuit of her, but light and partial Winds having come on, prevented our closing with her on that Day; we, however, evidently made her out to be a French Ship of War, and very diftinctly faw her Intention of making for the Gulf of Valoua. Our Course was directed accordingly, and Daylight on the following Morning discovered her moored with Cables to the Walls of the Fortress of Valona, mounting Fourteen Eighteen and Twentyfour-Pounders, with another Fort on an Eminence above her, completely commanding the whole An chorage. A Breeze at length favouring us, at One P. M. His Majesty's Ship was auchored in a Position at once to take or destroy the Enemy, and at the same Time to keep in check the formidable Force we faw prepared to support the French Frigate. A most animated and well directed Fire was opened on the Enemy's Slip. The Forts making no Effort to protect her, and our Attention being thus undivided, the Contest of Course was very short. She surrendered after a few Broadlides, and proved to be Le Var French Frigate, pierced for Thirty-two Guns, but having only Twenty-two Nine-Pounders and Four Twenty-four-Pounder Carronades mounted, commanded by Capitaine de Frigate Paulin, with a Complement of Two Hundred Men, from Corfu, destined to any Port in Italy she could reach.

I cannot close my Letter without expressing my Regret, that the Occasion had not afforded more Room for the Display of that Exertion and Gal-Santry which my Officers and Shin's Company have proved themselves at all Times so ready to evince; and it is with fincere Satisfaction I add, that, with the Exception of some trisling Damage in our Rigging, we sustained no Loss whatever; that of the Enemy cannot be ascertained, as the greater Part of her Officers and Ship's Company took the Opportunity of getting on Shore the Moment the

Ship struck.

Le Var is but Two Years off the Stocks, coppered, and Copper-fattened, and Eight Hundred Tons Burthen.

His Majesty's Ship Amphion, at Sca, Feb. 10, 1809. My Lord,

THE Redwing joined me on the 8th Instant off Long Island, with Information that an Armed Brig and a Trabacculo were lying in a small Creek in the Island of Malida. I proceeded there in confequence with the Redwing, and found the above Veffels advantageously moored for defending the Entrance of the Creek, and feveral Hundred Soldiers drawn up behind fome Houses and Walls. The Brig and a Twelve-Pounder from the Shore opened on the Ships whilst they were taking their Stations, which was no fooner effected, than they fled in all Directions.

She mounted Six Twelve-Pounder Carronades, had failed from Zara, in Company with the Trabacculo, on the 4th January, with Four Hundred French Troops for Ancona, which, on our Approach, landed, and were those I mentioned above, but kept a respectable Distance from our Guns the whole Time. The Boats' Crews of the Two Ships, under the Direction of Lieutenant Phillott, landed, and brought off Three Guns, One Twelve-Pounder and Two small ones, and destroyed Two Storehouses of Wine and Oil collected there

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that at Five Yellerday Evening, Dieppe bearing South, distant Seven or Eight Leagues, His Majelly's Sloop Royalitt, under my Command, feli in with Five Freuch Lugger Privateers, to which we immediately gave chace, and, after a Run of Two Hours and a Quarter, captured La Princesse, of Sixteen Gans and Fifty Men; the other Four, during the short Interval of exchanging Prisoners, it being then nearly dark, and rather hazy, made their Elcape. I feel happy in having made this Capture, as the has hitherto been a most successful Cruizer.
