A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 26th of April 1809,

PRESENT,

'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majelty, by His Order in Council of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, was pleased, for the Reafons affigned therein, to order that " all the Ports and Places of France and her Allies, or of any other Country at War with His Majefty, and all other Ports or Places in Europe from which, al-though not at War with His Majelty, the British Flag is excluded, and all Ports or Places in the Colonies belonging to His Majefty's Enemies, should from thenceforth be fubject to the fame Rellrictions in point of Trade and Navigation, as if the fame were actually blockaded in the moft ftrict and rigorous Manner ;" and also to prohibit " all Trade in Articles which are the Produce or Manufacture of the faid Countries or Colonies :" And whereas His Majesty having been nevertheless desirous not to subject those Countries which were in Alliance or in Amity with His Majelly to any greater Inconvenience than was abfolutely infeparable from carrying into Effect His Majefly's just Determination to counteract the Defigns of His Enemies, did make certain Exceptions and Modifications expressed in the faid Order of the Eleventh of November, and in certain subsequent Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November, declaratory of the aforefaid Order of the Eleventh of November and the Eighteenth of December Ore thousand eight hundred and feven, and the Thirlieth of March One thousand eight hundred and eight :

And whereas, in confequence of divers Events which have taken place free the Date of the firftmentioned Order affecting the Relation between Great Brithin and the Territorics of other Powers, it is expedient that fandry Parts and Provisions of the faid Orders should be altered or revoked :

His Majefty is therefore pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke and annul the faid feveral Orders, except as hereinafter expressed, and fo much of the faid feveral Orders, encept as aforefaid, is hereby revoked accordingly.

And His Majefty is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all the Ports and Places, as far North as the River Ems inclusively, under the Government filling itfelf the Kingdom of Holland, and all Ports and Places under the Government of Erance, together with the Colonies, Plantations, and Settlements in the Poffeffion of those Governments respectively, and all Ports and Places in the Northern Parts of Italy, to be reckoned from the Ports of Orbitello and Pefare inclusively, shall continue and be subject to the fame Restrictions, in point of Trade and Navigation, without any Exception, as if the fame were actually blockaded by His Majefty's Naval Forces in the most strict and rigorous Manner; and that every Veffel trading from and to the faid Countries or Colonies, Plantations or Settlements, together with all Goods and Merchandife on board, shall be condemned as Prize to the Captors.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Order shall have Effect from the Day of the Date thereof, with Respect to any Ship, together with its Cargo, which may be captured fublequent to fuch Day on any Voyage which is and shall be rendered legal by this Order, although fuch Voyage at the Time of the Commencement of the fame was unlawful and prohibited under the faid former Orders; and fuch Ships, upon being brought in, shall be released accordingly; and with Respect to all Ships, together with their Cargoes, which may be captured in any Voyage which was permitted under the Exceptions of the Orders above mentioned, but which is not permitted ac-cording to the Provisions of this Order, His Majeily is pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered, that fuch Ships, and their Cargoes, shall not he liable to Condemnation, unleis they shall have re-ceived actual Notice of the prefent Order before fuch Cappure; or in Default of fuch Notice, until after the Expiration of the like Intervals from the Date of this Order, as were allowed for constructive Notice in the Orders of the Twenty-fifth of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, and the Eighteenth of May One thousand eight hun-dred and eight, at the leveral Places and Latitudes therein specified.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commif-

fioners of His Majefty's Treasury, His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commitfioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.
