

bearing Date the 5th of October last, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of certain Articles of Provision, in the Manner and under the Conditions therein mentioned; and whereas by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty, intitled "An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation, and to permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament," which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, shall, from and after the said Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine, be, and the same is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and ten, except so far as respects the Exportation of Corn, Grain, or Flour to Ireland; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and ten, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be imported with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said above recited Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. *Steph. THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein

named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament for enabling His Majesty to establish a permanent Local Militia Force, under certain Restrictions, for the Defence of the Realm.

An Act to permit certain Articles, the Growth, Production, or Manufacture of Europe, to be laden and shipped on board Ships arriving with British North American Produce and Fish, taken by Settlers in the British North American Colonies, at any Port of Europe, in order to be exported to the principal Ports in the British Colonies and Plantations in North America.

An Act for better regulating the Public Records of Scotland.

An Act to amend an Act made in the Forty-eighth Year of His present Majesty to provide, that British Ships captured by the Enemy, becoming the Property of British Subjects, shall not be entitled to the Privilege of British Ships.

An Act for regulating the Mode in which the Average Price of Brown or Muscovado Sugar, exclusive of the Duty thereon, is to be ascertained, under the Provisions of an Act passed in the Forty-sixth Year of His present Majesty.

An Act to permit Goods brought in as Prize and restored by the Court of Admiralty, or which have been seized as Droits and so restored, to be sold or transferred within this Kingdom without paying the Home Consumption Duty.

An Act for more conveniently paying of Allowances on the Compassionate List of the Navy, and of Half-Pay to Officers of the Royal Marines.

An Act to authorize the Principal Officers of the Customs in the British Colonies and Plantations in America and the West Indies to examine Witnesses on Oath.

An Act for more equally and effectually assessing and collecting the Poor Rates within the Parish of Saint Anne, commonly called Saint Anne, Limehouse, in the County of Middlesex.

An Act for better assessing and collecting the Poor and other Rates in the Parish of Saint Nicholas, in the City of Rochester, in the County of Kent, and regulating the Poor thereof.

An Act for repealing an Act passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for the Improvement of the River Wear and Port and Haven of Sunderland, in the County-Palatine of Durham, and for the more effectual Preservation and further Improvement of the same River, Port, and Haven.

An Act to amend and enlarge the Powers of the several Acts relating to the Stratford-upon-Avon Canal Navigation.

An Act for amending and rendering more effectual an Act, passed in the Fifteenth Year of His present Majesty, for draining and preserving certain Lands and Grounds in the Parishes of Wisbech Saint Peter's and Wisbech Saint Mary's, and in the Hamlets of Wisbech Murrow and Wisbech Guyhirn, in the Isle of Ely, and County of Cambridge.

An Act for inclosing and draining Lands in the Parishes of Thurlton, Haddiscoe, and Thorpe, next Haddiscoe, in the County of Norfolk.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of
