AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 10th of May 1809,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a Treaty of Amity has been concluded between His Majesty and the Sublime Porte, it is this Day ordered by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council. That the Order made by His Majesty in Council, bearing Date the Thirteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and seven, by which it is directed, "That no Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports within the Dominions of the Grand Signior until further Order, and that a general Embargo or Stop be made of all Ships or Vessels whatever belonging to the Subjects of the Grand Signior within any of His Majesty's Dominions, together with all Persons and Effects on board all such Ships and Vessels; and that the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War and Privateers do detain and bring into Port all Ships and Vessels belonging to the Subjects of the Grand Signior, or bearing the Flag of the Ottoman Empire," be henceforth revoked and discharged: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain
