HIS late Majesty having been graciously pleased,
by His Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual,
dated the 10th Day of June 1733, to establish cer-
tain Rules and Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows
of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy;
these are to give Notice, that Copies of the said Rules

and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of His
Majesty's Navy at Chatham, Portsmouth, and Ply-
mouth, as also with the Clerks of the Cheque at
Deptford, Woolwich, and Sheerness, and with the
Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinsale; where
all such Widows as intend to lay in their Claims may
be informed of all Particulars which entitle them to
the Benefit of the said Charity, and receive the proper
Certificates for that Purpose; but such Widows as live
at too great a Distance from the Places above mentioned,
may apply, by Letter, to Mr. M. Waller Ciston, at the
Admiralty-Office, who will send them all necessary In-
formation. And the Governors of the said Charity in-
tending to distribute to the Widows of Sea Officers, whose
Circumstances come within the Rules of the Establish-
ment, such Monies as may be due to them on the 21st of
May instant; This is to give Notice, that any Widows
who have not yet applied, and intend to lay in their
Claims, may do so as soon as possible; and that all such
Widows, whose Claims have been already allowed, may
send or bring to this Office, as soon as possible, the Affi-
davits required by the Rules, in order to their being con-
tinued upon their Pension or Bounty.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of a certain Act of Parlia-
ment, made and passed in the Forty-eighth Year
of the Reign of our present Lord the King, intituled
"An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum
of Money to be raised by Lotteries," Francis Hurnsby
and William Wakefield, of No 412, Strand, in the
County of Middlesex, Lottery-Office Keepers, did, on
the 1st Day of April 1809, receive a Licence from the
Commissioners for managing the Duties upon Stamped
Vellum, Parchment, and Paper, for the Time being in
England, to divide Lottery Tickets into Shares, and to
issue such Chances as by the said Act are permitted to be
issued, and to register the Numbers of any Tickets in
the Lotteries authorized by the said Act, at their House
or Place situate at No 412, Strand aforesaid, which
Licence was to continue in Force till after the Ex-
piration of the Drawing of the last of the Lotteries
to be drawn under the Authority of the said Act; and
whereas it is by the said Act directed, that all and
every Person and Person to whom such Licence or
Licences should be granted in Great Britain, pursuant
to the said Act, should deposit at some Office or Place
at or in the Head Office of the said Commissioners in
London, appointed and established by the said Commis-
sioners for that Purpose, Thirty whole unarawed Tickets
in each of the Lotteries to be established by the said
Act, for every such Licence granted to him, her, or
them, according to the true Intent and Meaning of the
said Act; and that every such Licence, for which no
Deposit should be made, should be void and of no Effect;
and that every Person acting under any such Licence in
any of the Masters therein contained, after such De-
fault made, should be adjudged and considered in every
Respect as an unlicensed Person; and that it should be
lawful for the said Commissioners upon every such De-
fault, to cause to be published the Names and Places of
Abode, and the Description of the Office, of such Per-
sons or Person making such Default as aforesaid, in the
London Gazette, and to declare therein the Time when
such Default was made, and that such Forfeiture should
take place from the Time of such Publication; and
whereas the Drawing of the second of the said Lot-
teries in the said Act mentioned, being the next of the
said Lotteries after the granting of the said Licence to
