A.T. the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 17th of May 1809,

PRESENT,

'The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

XTHEREAS by an Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-fixth April One thousand eight hundred and nine, His Majefty was pleafed to direct, that the Blockade imposed by that Order should extend to all Ports and Places as far North as the River Ems inclutively; His Majefty, more diffinctly to afcertain the Places to be taken as included within the Limits of the faid Blockade, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of 'His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Blockade shall be construed to extende to as to comprehend the Eaftern as well as the Weltern . Ems; and to prevent all Veffels from failing into · or out of that River by any Channel to the Weft--ward of the Island of Juylt : And the Right Hoa nourable the Lords Commillioners of His Majefty's Treasury, His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, : and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty; and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to ' Steph. Cottrell. them may respectively appertain.

ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Sunday next the 21st Instant, for Four Days, for the late Duke of Bevern, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk or Velvet, co. loured Ribbons; Fans and Tippets, or plain White, - or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuffs, with Black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear Black Coats, and Black or plain White, 'or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuff Waiflcoats, full trimmed, coloured. Swords and Buckles.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir James Sau-marez, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Baltic, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board the Victory, in Wingo Sound, the 6th Inflant.

SIR, HEREWITH I inclose, for the Information of the Lords Commillioners of the Admiralty, a Letter from Captain Parker, of His Majefty's Ship Melpomene, addreffed to Rear-Admiral Sir Samuel Hood, giving an Account of his having chafed a Danish Man of War Cutter on Shore, and after-wards deltroyed her, with fome other Vessels, by the Boats of that Ship, under the Directions of Lieutenants Plumridge and Rennie; the latter Offcer and Five Men being feverely wounded. In which Enterprife great Gallantry and Spirit appears to have been difplayed I am, &c.

SIR, Sleeve, May 1, 1809. I BEG Leave to acquaint you, that having chafed a Danifh Man of War Cutter, of Six Guns, and apparently quite new, on Shore at Huilbo, (a Harbour in Jutland,) and anchored His Majefty's Ship in Nincteen Feet Water, the Boats were fent under the Dischions of Lieutenants Plumridge and
