VHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-third Day of November laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwile, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms and A mmunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued tor fome Time longer, His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of tis Priyy Council, leveloy order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatoever, (except the Mafter General ot the Ordnance for His Majetty's Service, do at any 'Cime, during the Space of Sis Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June mext, prefume to traniport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaltwile, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or hip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship. or Veffel, in order
to tranfporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, without Leave or Permifion in that Behalf firt obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Ccuncil, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Pe nalties inflicted by an A\&t, paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majeity's Reign, intituled "An "Act ta empower His Majelty to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enfurce the " Law for empowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms or Ammunitio.1; and alfo to emposer "His Majetty to reftrain the carrying Coaltwife of "Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of A Ams or "Ammunition:"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiftioners of His Majetty's 'l'reafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Adminal of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majeltys Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.
