The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council of the Twenty-fourth Day of May instant, was pleased to order that the Orders of His MajeRy in Council of the Seventh of January and Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven should be suspended, so far as was necessary for the Protection of Vessels of the United States of America, failing for or from the Ports of Hoiland, for a limited Time, and under certain Circumflances; His Majesty, more distinctly to ascertain the Southern Boundary of the Countries to be taken as comprized under the Description of Holland in fuch Order, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Order shall not be construed to extend or to comprehend the Island of Walcheren, which is in the Possession of France, or any Port or Place South of the faid Island; but, nevertheless, no Vessel of the said United States, which shall have been dellined to the Island of Walcheren, or to any Port or Place on the North Bank of the River Schelde, shall be Hable to Capture under this Order, unless such-Vessel shall have been informed of this Order on her Voyage, and warned by any of His Majerly's Ships or Privateers not to proceed to the -faid Island of Walcheren, or to any Port or Place in the River Schelde:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS the Island of Heligoland furrendered to His Majesty's Forces, and is now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Trade to and from Heligoland shall be confined to British Ships, navigated according to Law, except in Cases where His Majesty may be pleased by His special Licence otherwise to permit.

And for the more effectually preventing any Foreign Veffel carrying on any Trade, to or from the faid Island, contrary to His Majesty's Will and Pleafure, as by this Order expressed, His Majesty is further pleased by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Foreign Vessel except as before excepted, shall enter into the Port, Harbour or Road lying between the Island of Heligoland, and Sandy Island, and the Shoals of the faid Islands respectively, and commonly called or known by the Names of the North Haven, and the South Haven, under any Pretence whatever; and that no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize what soever, shall be in any Manner put on Shore in any Part of the faid Island of Heligoland, from any fuch Foreign Vellel, or carried from the Shore of such Island, to any such Foreign Vessel, or in any manner transhipped from any such Foreign Vessel, into any Vessel lying in the said Harbour, Pott, or Road, or from any Vessel lying in the said Harhour, Port, or Road, into any fuch Foreign Veffel .-- And the Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may re-Steph. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His VV Order in Council of the Twenty fixth of April last, to declare certain Ports and Places of the Countries which have been lately flyled the Kingdom of Holland, to be subject to the Restrictions incident to a strict and rigorous Blockade, as continued from His Majesty's former Order of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and feven; and whereas Advices have been received of a certain provisional Agreement entered into by His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in America, with the Government of the United States, whereby it is underflood that His Majesty's Orders in Council of the Seventh of January and of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, shall be withdrawn so far as respects the United States, on the Tenth of June next.

And whereas, although the faid Provisional Agreement is not fuch as was authorized by His Majesty's Instructions, or fuch as His Majesty can approve, it may already have happened, or may happen, that Persons being Citizens of the said United States may be led by a Reliance on the said Provisional Agreement, to engage in Trade with and to the said Ports and Places of Holland, contrary to, and in violation of the Restrictions imposed by the said Orders of the Seventh of January and of the Eleventh of November One thouland eight hundred and seven, as altered by the Order of the Twenty-fixth of

Inconveniences that may ensue from the Circumstance above recited, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered. That the faid feveral Orders shall be suspended, so far as is necessary for the Protection of Vessels of the faid United States, so failing under the Faith of the faid Provisional Agreement, videlicet, That after the Ninth Day of June next, no Veffel of the United States, which shall have cleared out between the Nineteenth of April laft, and the Twentieth of July ensuing, for any of the Ports of Holland aforesaid from any Port of the United States, shall be molested or interrupted in her Voyage by the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships or Privateers.

And it is further ordered, that no Veffels of the United States, which shall have cleared out from any Port of America previous to the Twentieth of July next, for any other permitted Port, and shall, during her Voyage, have changed her Destination, in confequence of Information of the faid Provisional Agreement, and shall be proceeding to any of the Ports of Holland aforefaid, shall be molested or interrupted by the Commanders of any of His Majel'y's Ships or Privateers, unless such Vessel shall have been informed of this Order on her Voyage, and shall have been warned not to proceed to any of the Ports of Holland aforefaid, and shall, notwithstanding such Warning, be found attempting to proceed to any fuch Port.

And it is further ordered, that after the faid Ninth Day of June next, no Vessel of the faid United States which shall have cleared out for, or be destined to any of the Ports of Holland from any other Port or Place not subject to the Restrictions of the said Order of the Twenty-fixth of April last, after Notice of such Provisional Agreement as aforefaid, shall be molested or interrupted in her Voyage by the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships or Privateers, provided such Vessel shall have so cleared out previous to actual Notice of this Order at fuch Place of Clearance, or in default of Proof of actual Notice previous to the like Periods of Time after the Date of this Order, as are fixed for constructive Notice of His Majesty's Order of the Eleventh of November, One thousand eight hundred and feven, by the Orders of the Twenty-fifth November, One thousand eight hundred and seven, and of the Eighteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and eight, at certain Places and Latitudes therein mentioned, unless such Vessel shall have been informed of this Order on her Voyage, and, warned by any of His Majesty's Ships or Privateers not to proceed to any Port of Holland, and shall notwithstanding such Warning, attempt to proceed to any fuch Port.

And His Majesty is pleased further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid feveral Orders or the Seventh of January and Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, as altered by the faid Order of the Twenty-fixth of April laft, shall also be suspended, so far as is necessary for the Protection of Vessels of the said United States which shall clear out, to any Ports not declared to be under the Restriction of Biockade from any Port of Holland between the Ninth Day of June and the First Day of July next; provided always, that nothing that is contained in the present Order shall extend, or be construed to extend, to protect any Vessels or their April last; His Majetty, in order to prevent any | Cargoes, that may be liable to Condemnation or Detention for any other Caule than the Violation of the aforesaid Orders of the Seventh of January and the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, as altered by the said Order of the Twenty-fixth of April last.

Provided also, that nothing in this Order contained shall extend, or be construed to extend to protect any Vessel which shall attempt to enter any Port actually blockaded by any of His Majesty's

Ships of War.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commisfioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively apper-Steph. A DISPATCH, of which the following is a Copy, as been received from Lieutenant-General Sir George Beckwith, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Forces in the Leeward Islands, by Lord Viscount Castlereagh, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Fort Royal, Martinique, My Lord, April 20, 1809.

THE French Squadron, confifting of Three Sail

of the Line and Two Frigates, from L'Orient, having taken Shelter in the Saints, in the Vicinity of Guadaloupe, where they were blockaded by Rear-Admiral Sir Alexander Cochrane with a fuperior Force, I detached a Corps, of between Two and Three Thousand Men, under the Command of Major-General Maitland, to co-operate with the Navy in the Reduction of those Islands, to destroy or capture the Ships of the Enemy, or to force them to Sea.

I have the Satisfaction to report to your Lordship, for His Majetty's Information, that after Three Days of great Toil and most active Service, the Forts were reduced, and the Troops surrendered

Prisoners of War.

The French Ships of the Line pushed to Sea early on the Night of the 14th; on the 16th the Admiral was within Four Miles of them, and, I trust, will be enabled to bring them to close Action.

I have the Honour to inclose the Major-General's Report upon the honourable Termination of this Service; and I beg Leave to recommend to His Majesly's favourable Consideration, the meritorious Services of this General Officer, not only in the present Inflance, where he held a diffinet Command, but for his general good Conduct during the whole Campaign.

The Officers of all Ranks have done their Duty in an exemplary Manner, and the Troops employed upon this Service have maintained that Superiority which has distinguished this Army during the whole Series of our Operations fince our Departure from Barbadoes.

SIR, Camp, at the Saints, April 18, 1809. I HAVE the Honour to transmit you a Report of the Proceedings of His Majesty's Troops detached for the Reduction of the Saints.

We failed from Fort Royal Bay on the 12th; Captain Beaver, of His Majesty's Ship Acatta, who was Commodore of the Division, left the Squadron under Charge of Captain Carthew, of His Majetty's Ship Gloire, and went forward to meet Rear-Admiral Sir Alexander Cochrane. The 13th was passed in examining the Enemy's Positions, and in

making Arrangements.

The Disembarkation was fixed to be at Six o'clock in the Morning of the 14th, but a bad Night feparated our Ships. By Ten they were collected. Soon after the Acasta led in, through a very narrow Channel which was buoyed on each Side. The Gloire, Narcissus, and Circe followed; the Intrepid about an Hour after, but the Dolphin not until next Day. His Majesty's Ships anchored opposite to the little Bay Bois Joly. The Landing was meant to have been at the next to the Eastward, called Ance Vanovre. As much Time, it was then feen, would be loft by persevering to go to Ance Vanovre, because the Boats would have had a long Row against Wind and Current, we landed at Ance Bois Joly; a secure Landing, though a stony Beach, protected by the Fire of the Frigates. We experienced no Opposition, except a Cannonade from the Islet of Cabrit, the Guns of which fired over the Ridge

among the Shipping. When advanced to the first Ridge, we found the Enemy occupied the great Mountain which is above Eight hundred Feet high, called Mount Russel. This was immediately on our Right, nor could we The Rifle Companies of the 3d and of advance. the 4th Battalions 60th Regiment were ordered to dislodge the Enemy. The Exertion of these Companies under Captains Dolling and Lupton was great; the Ascent no less steep than an Angle of Fifty Degrees, covered with Bush and prickly Pears, they most gallantly effected the Service, and drove back the Enemy who suffered considerably. The Risle Companies were supported to their Right by the Flank Companies of the 3d West India Regiment and One Company of the Royal York Ran-

gers led by Lieutenant-Colonel Campbell, Deputy Adjutant-General, whom I detached for this Service. We had now a strong Position. Before us were the Enemy's three Forts, showing stout Garrifons, and Three Line of Battle Ships, and Two Frigates in the Harbour. The large Ships very full of Men. We found, however, we could not advance without being flanked on our Left by the Fort on Isle de Cabrit. Two Eight-Inch Howitzers were immediately landed, a Battery quickly constructed by Lieutenant Hobbs of the Royal Engineers. Brigadier General Stehelin of the Royal Artillery and all his Officers and Men were molt strenuous, and before Six that Evening our Battery opened on the Enemy's Squadron at a very fair Distance. About an Hour after there were Indications that the French Squadron was about to push out, and by Eight it was not doubtful. Not a Monient was lolt; Captain De Courcy of the Quarter-Master-General's Department was sent by me to Captain Beaver of the Acasta, and we fired Six Rockets from a Headland at Five Minutes interval, being the fignal fixed on by the Admiral. About Ten at Night, the Three French Line of Battle Ships were feen to go through the windward Passage. Next Morning, the 15th Inflant, the Intrepid was the only Line of Battle Ship in Sight.

The Difficulty of advancing on the West Side of the Island, forced us to re-embark the greater Part of our Troops, to land at Ance Vanovre, but as the Enemy occupied a strong and commanding Polition on the East Side of this Bay, Lieutenant-Colonel Prescot, with the Flank Companies of the sthe 3d West India Regiment, and the Two Risle Companies of the 60th, and Major Henderson with the Referve, were ordered to descend from Morne Russel to protect the Landing, and to dislodge the Enemy. This was well executed, and we gained a favourable Polition, whence our Mortars could reach Fort Napoleon at a proper Distance, as well as the Fort on the Iflet. A Mortar Battery of Two Thirteen-Inch, and Four Ten-Inch was immediately begun, and carried on with unremitted Exertions; -all our Men volunteering every Labour. Between the Enemy's Forts Napoleon and Morelle, and us, was a Middle Ridge, which was on the Back of the Town, and held by the Enemy. On the Night of 15th, a strong Picquet of the Enemy's was furprifed by Two Companies of the Royal York Rangers, commanded by Captain Starke, and Lieutenant White. The French had One Officer and Seventeen Men bayonetted, and Twelve Priloneers were brought away. This Affair was highly creditable to the Officers named. The Night following we determined to occupy the Middle Ridge, and confine the Enemy within his Works. Major Alen was ordered with the Two Flank Companies of the 3d West India, and a Flank Company of the 8th West India for this Service,—he was supported by Part of the Royal York Rangers under Major Henderson. The Position was taken up without Opposition, but about Eight next Morning the Enemy advanced from Forts Napoleon and Morelle to recover this Ground. A sharp Action took place, the whole of the York Rangers, and the Rifle Companies of the 60th, importing our Black Troops. The Ground lay open in great Part to the Grape Shot from Forts Napoleon and Morrelle, and to Round Shot from Islet de Cabrit; but

all our Troops were undaunted; -none were more brave or active than the Flank Companies of the 3d West India Regiment, and a Flank Company of the 8th West India under Major Alen. The Enemy was driven back with Lofs, and our Possession of the Ground completely fecured. On this Occasion our Loss was about Thirty Men, killed and wounded.

I omitted to say that the Two French Frigates, both landed with Flour, took their Chance of escaping on the Forenoon of the 15th. They went through the Windward Passage, keeping a little from the Wind to gain the Shore of Guadaloupe. The leading Frigate was engaged by His Majetty's Ship Intrepid. This Frigate however doubled the Point of Vieux Fort, was followed by the other, and both escaped into Basse Terre.

About the Middle of the Day, Yesterday the 17th, the French Commandant, Colonel Madier, fent a Flag of Truce to enter into Terms. They expected what we would not concede, and they submitted to what we were willing to grant. They are Prisoners

of War.

I understand their Number to be from Seven to Eight Hundred; of this Number, Six Hundred

were landed by the French Squadron.

We are to take Possession of the Forts this Evening at Four o'Clock. The French Troops will be immediately embarked, and I shall proceed to carry the Remainder of your Orders into Execution without Loss of Time. But I must not conclude my Report without doing Justice to the Merits of those whom I have been so happy as to command.

The Navy have most cordially supported us. Captain Beaver of His Majesty's Ship Acasta, has increased that Character which I know his Conduct at Bay Robert, Martinique, in your Presence gained His Arrangement and Presence of Mind render him particularly qualified for joint Operations. Captain Carthew of the Gloire, and Captain Malcolm of the Narciffus, also merit the warmest Acknowledgment: and I am also much obliged to the Honourable Captain Bertie of His Majeity's Ship Dart, who acted on Shore

The Royal Artillery under Brigadier General Stehelin, have continued their usual spirited Man-If the Enemy had not capitulated Yesterday, we should have opened a fine Battery of Six Mortars; and I am certain from what happened at Martinique, our Artillery would have given them enough

of it in One Night.

To Lieutenant Colonel Rial 15th Regiment, I with Pleasure acknowledge the Assistance I have received from him. He tantalized me with an Offer to take Fort Morelli by Assault with the 15th Regiment the Morning of Yesterday during the Action. Lieutenant Colonel Prevost deserves equal good Report. Major Henderson who commands the Reserve is a true Soldier; and Major Alen, 3d West India Regiment, gallantly led his black Troops.

The Staff have all been active. Lieutenant-Colonel Campbell. Deputy Adjutant-General, has been always forward; he is an Officer who must rife

from his Merit.

The Honourable Captain de Courcy, of the Quarter-Master-General's Department, has shewn an Activity and Exertion which does him great Credit, and proves him to be an Officer for Service. Lieutenant Hobbs, Royal Engineers, yields to



no one in Work, and is an admirable Officer for a Service of this Nature.

The Medical Department has been ably conducted

by Doctor Burke.

I have been much affisted by Colonel Soler, the

Royalist, a Man inflexible in Loyalty.

My Aide-de-Camp, Captain Taynton, 64th
Regiment, will have the Honour to deliver this
Dispatch to you; he has been many Years with me; I wish I could get him the Promotion his Merit deferves.

ARTICLES of CAPITULATION proposed by Colonel Madier, Member of the Legion of Honour, Commandant of all the Saints, to Major-General Maitland, commanding the Troops of His Britannic Majesty, and Captain Beaver, of His Majesty's Ship Acasta, Senior Naval Officer,

LEUTENANT-COLONEL CAMPBELL, Deputy Adjutant-General, and Captain Mercier, of the 66th Regiment, in the Service of France, being appointed Commissioners, agreed upon the following Terms.

Article I. ALL the Troops shall march out with all the Honours of War.

II. They shall be Prisoners of War, and conveyed to England.

III. The Officers shall equally be considered as Prisoners of War upon their Paroles of Honour, to be transported to England until exchanged. They shall retain their Swords.

Answer.—Articles I, II, and III, granted.

To be carried into Execution between Twelve and Four o'Clock.

Arms to be deposited Outside of the different Forts, and the Troops to embark immediately after.

IV. The Troops shall retain their personal Bag-. gage.

Answer .- Granted.

V. The Officers shall also retain their private Baggage.

∹Granted. Answer.-

VI. All the Officers regularly employed in the Administration, and Medical Officers, shall not be considered as Prisoners of War; they shall be sent to Guadaloupe, with their private Baggage.

Answer - Granted.

VII. Private Property shall be respected, and the

'Inhabitants shall return to their Houses.

Answer.-All Inhabitants possessing Property in the Saints who are not Soldiers in the Service of France, may return to their Houses, and shall not be molested as long as they conform to the Laws of the Colony.

All private Property shall be respected, and every Individual treated with the same Liberality and good

Faith of the British Nation. 190, 16262.

VIII. Whatever is doubtful in these Articles of Capitulation, shall be construed in favour of the Inhabitants.

Answer.—Granted.

ADDITIONAL ARTICLE.

AN Officer of Artillery and One civil Officer shall be appointed from each Side, who will meet at this Spot To-morrow Morning at Eight o'Clock, in order to take a List of all Military Stores and other public Property. They shall be given precisely in the State they are at this Moment.

Downing-Street, June 2, 1809. DISPATCH, of which the following is a DISPATCH, of which the following is a Copy, was this Day received by Lord Viccount Castlereagh, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from Lieutenant-General the Right Honourable Sir Arthur Wellesley, K. B.

My Lord, Monte Alegre, May 18, 1809.

HEN I determined upon the Expedition to the North of Portugal, against Marshall Soult, I was in hopes that the Portuguese General

Silvierra, would be able to hold his Post upon the Tamaga, till he should be reinforced; by which, and by the Possession of Chaves, the Enemy's Retreat would have been cut off, excepting across the Minho; and I intended, if succeisful, to press him so hard, that the Passage of that River would have been impracticable.

The Loss of the Bridge of Amaranthe, however, on the 2d instant, altered our Prospects: I had no hopes that Marihall Beresford, who marched towards the Upper Part of the Douro on the Fifth, and arrived at Lamego on the Tenth, would be able to effect more than confine the Enemy on that Side, and oblige him to retire by Chaves into Gallicia,

rather than by Villa Real into Castille.

General Beresford, however, having obliged the Enemy's Polls at Villa Real, and Maisan Frien to fall back with fome Loss, and having croffed the Douro, drove in General Loisons Out-Posts at the Bridge of Amaranthe; and again acquired Possession of the left Bank of the Tamaga on the Twelfth, the Day on which the Corps under my Command forced the l'affage of the Douro at Oporto.

Loifon retired from Amaranthe on the Morning of the 13th, as foon as he had heard of the Events at Oporto of the preceding Day, and met the advanced Guard of the French Army at a short Diffance from the Town, which General Berestord

immediately occupied.

I was unable to commence the Pirfuit of the Enemy till the Morning of the 13th, when the Hanoverian Legion moved to Valonga, under Major-General Murray. On that Evening, I was informed that the Enemy had in the Morning destroyed a great Proportion of his Cannon in the Neighbourhood of Penafiel, and had directed his March towards Braga.

This appeared to he the probable Refult of the Situation in which he found himself, in consequence of General Beresford's Operations upon the Tamaga; and as foon as I had afcertained that the Fact was true, I marched on the Morning of the 14th with the Army in two Columns towards the River

Minho.

At the same Time I directed General Beresford upon Chaves, in case the Enemy should turn to his Right; and Major General Murray to communicate with General Beresford, if he should find, as reported, that Loison remained in the Neighbourhood of  ${f A}$  maranthe.

On the Evening of the 14th, I was certain from the Movements of the Enemy's Detachments in the Neighbourhood of Braga, that he intended to direct his Retreat upon Chaves on Monte Alegre; and directed General Beresford, in case of the latter Movement, to push on for Monterey, so as to stop the Enemy, if he should pass by Villa de Rey

General Beresford had anticipated my Orders to march his own Corps upon Chaves, and had already fent General Silvierra to occupy the Passes of Ruivaes and Melgaffey near Salamonde, but he was un-

fortunately too late.

I arrived at Braga on the 15th, (General Murray being at Guimaraens, and the Enemy about Fifteen Miles in our Front) and at Salamonde on the Six-

We had there an Assair with their Rear Guard. The Guards under Lieutenant-General Sherbrooke,

and Brigadier General Campbell attacked their Polition; and having turned their Left Flank by the Heights, they abandoned it, leaving: a Gun and some Prisoners belind them. This Attack was necessarily made at a late Hour in the Evening.

On the Seventeenth, we moved to Ruivaes (waiting to fee whether the Enemy would turn upon Chaves, or continue his Retreat upon Monte Alegre)

and on the Eighteenth to this Place.

I here found that he had taken a Road through the Mountains towards Orenfe, by which it would be difficult, if not impossible, for me to overtake him, and on which I had no Means of stopping him.

The Enemy commenced this Retreat, as I have informed your Lordship, by destroying a great Proportion of his Guns and Ammunition. He afterwards destroyed the Remainder of both, and a great Proportion of his Baggage, and kept nothing excepting what the Soldiers or a few Mules could carry. He has left behind him his Sick and Wounded: and the Road from Penasiel to Monte Alegre is strewed with the Carcases of Horse and Mules, and French Soldiers, who were put to Death by the Peasantry before our Advanced Guard could save them.

This last Circumstance is the natural Effect of the Species of Warfare which the Enemy have carried

on in this Country.

Their Soldiers have plundered and murdered the Peafantry at their Pleafure; and I have feen many Perfons hanging in the Trees by the Sides of the Road, executed for no Reason that I could learn, excepting that they have not been friendly to the French Invasion and Uturpation of the Government of their Country; and the Route of their Column on their Retreat could be traced by the Smoke of the Villages to which they set Fire.

the Villages to which they fet Fire.

We have taken about Five Hundred Prisoners.

Upon the whole the Enemy has not lost less than a
Fourth of his Army, and all his Artillery and
Equipments, since we attacked him upon the Vonga.

I hope your Lordship will believe that no Measure which I could take was omitted to intercept the Enemy's Retreat. It is obvious, however, that if an Army throws away all its Cannon, Equipments, and Baggage, and every Thing which can strengthen it, and can enable it to act together as a Body, and abandons all those who are entitled to its Protection, but add to its Weight and impede its Progress, it must be able to march by Roads through which it cannot be followed with any Prospect of being overtaken by an Army which has not made the same Sacrifices.

It is impossible to say too much of the Exertions of the Troops. The Weather has been very bad indeed. Since the Thirteenth, the Rain has been constant, and the Roads in this difficult Country almost Impracticable. But they have persevered in the Pursuit to the last, and have been generally on their March from Day-light in the Morning till

Dark.
The Brigade of Guards were at the Head of the Column, and fet a laudable Example; and in the Affair with the Enemy's Rear Guard on the Evening of the 16th, they conducted themselves re-

markably well.

SIR, IT is with much Pleasure I acquaint you of the Capture of that notorious French National Felucca Joseph, of One Brass Nine-Pounder Gun and Two Three Pounders, commanded by Jean Botin, Enfign de Vaisseau, and manned with Fifty-three Men, cut out last Night from under the Batteries of St. Domingo by the Eight-oared Cutter, Yawl, and Gig of this Ship, manned by Volunteers, and commanded by Mr. Charles Fraser, Second Lieutenant.

The Felucca was fast by Two Hawsers on Shore; and they were in the act of warping her closer in when the was gallantly boarded and carried under a very heavy Fire of Grape and Musketry from the Vessel, and the whole Range of Batteries.

I lament to fay we had Seven Men wounded; amongst the Number Lieutenant Coryton, of the Royal Marines, in Four different Places; he is however, with the rest, likely to do well.

Lieutenant Fraser speaks in very high Terms of Praise of the Conduct of the whole; but has parti-cularly mentioned the Aid he received from Lieutenant Coryton, as likewife Mr. John Moore, Master's Mate, Mr. John Wilson, Midshipman, and Mr. Henry Morris, Master's Mate of the Sparrow.

Most of the Enemy finding Relistance vain, faved themselves by jumping overboard; only Nineteen have fallen into our Hands.

It appears to me that this Enterprize has been conducted with great Coolness and Gallantry. I. herewith fend a List of the Wounded.
