WHEREAS His Majelty, by His Order in Council of the Twenty-fourth Day of May inftant, was pleafed to order that the Orders of His Majelty in Council of the Seventh of January and Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and feven should be furfpended, fo far as was necessary for the Protection of Vessels of the United States of America, failing for or from the Ports of Holland, for a limited Time, and under certain Circumstances; His Majesty, more diffinctly to afcertain the Southern Boundary of the Countries to be taken as comprized under the Defeription of Holland in fuch Order, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Order shall not be construed to extend or to comprehend the Island of Walcheren, which is in the Poffestion of France, or any Port or Place South of the faid Ifland; bur, neverthelefs, no Vessel of the faid United States, which shall have been deflined to the Ifland of Walcheren, or to any Port or Place on the North Bank of the River Schelde, shall be liable to Capture under this Order, unlefs fuch Vefiel shall have been informed of this Order on her Voyage, and warned by any of His Majefty's Ships or Privateers not to proceed to the faid Island of Walcheren, or to any Port or Place in the River Schelde :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, His Majefty'-Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commifs fioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them may respectively apper Steph.
