The KING's Molt Excellent Majefly in Council.

WHEREAS His Majelty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the Twenty lixth of April laft, to declare certain Ports and Places of the Countries which have been lately ftyled the Kingdom of Holland, to be subject to the Reitrictions incident to a first and rigorous Blockade, as continued from His Majefty's former Order of the Eleventh of November One thouland eight hundred and feven; and whereas Advices have been received of a certain provisional Agreement entered into by His Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in America, with the Government of the United States, whereby it is understood that His Mojetty's Orders in Council of the Seventh of January and of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and feven, shall be withdrawn fo far as respects the United States, on the Tenth of June next.

And whereas, although the faid Provisional Agreement is not fuch as was authorized by His Majefty's Infirmctions, or fuch as His Majefty can approve, it may already have happened, or may happen, that Perfons being Citizens of the faid United States may be led by a Reliance on the faid Provisional Agreement, to engage in Trade with and to the faid Ports and Places of Holland, contrary to, and in violation of the Retirictions imposed by the faid Orders of the Seventh of January and of the Eleventh of November One thouland eight hundred and leven, as altered by the Order of the Twenty-fixth of April lait; His Majefty, in order to prevent any Inconveniences that may enfue from the Circumflance above recited, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid leveral Orders shall be in pended, so far as is necessary for the Protection of Veilels of the faid United States, fo failing under the Faith of the faid Provisional Agreement, vide-licet, That after the Ninth Day of June next, no Veffel of the United States, which shall have cleared out-between the Nineteenth of April lalt, and the

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 24th of Holland aforefaid from any Port of the United States, shall be molested or interrupted in her Voyage by the Commanders of His Majelty's Ships or Privateers

> And it is further ordered, that no Veffels of the United States, which shall have cleared out from any Port of America previous to the Twentieth of July next, for any other permitted Port, and fhall, during her Voyage, have changed her Deftination, in confequence of Information of the faid Provisional Agreement, and shall be proceeding to any of the Ports of Holland aforefaid, shall be moletted or interrupted by the Commanders of any of His Majelty's Ships or Privateers, unlefs such Vessel shall have been informed of this Order on her Voyage, and shall have been warned not to proceed to any of the Ports of Holland aforefaid, and scall, notwithstanding fuch Warning, be found attempting to proceed to any fuch Port.

> And it is forther ordered, that after the faid Ninth Day of June next, no Veffel of the faid United States which shall have cleared out for, or be deflined to any of the Ports of Holland from any other Port or Place not subject to the Restrictions of the faid Order of the Twenty fixth of April last, after Notice of such Provisional Agreement as aforefaid, shall be molethed or interrupted in her Voyage by the Commanders of His Majefty's Ships or Privateers, provided such Vessel shall have fo cleared out previous to actual Notice of this Order at fuch Place of Clearance, or in default of Proof of actual Notice previous to the like Periods of Time after the Date of this Order, as are fixed for conftructive Notice of His Majefiy's Order of the Eleventh of November, One thousand eight hundred and feven, by the Orders of the Tweaty-fifth November, One thoufand eight hundred and leven, and of the Eighteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and eight, at certain Places and Latitudes therein mentioned, unless such Vessel shall have been informed of this Order on her Voyage, and, warned by any of His Majefty's Ships or Privateers not to proceed to any Port of Holland, and shall notwithilanding such Warning, attempt to proceed to any fuch Port.

And His Majefty is pleafed further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid feveral Orders of the Seventh of January and Eleventh of November I wentieth of July enfuing, for any of the Ports of [One thousand eight hundred and feven, as altered les
