The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-third Day of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever; (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next; presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His

Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS the Island of Heligoland surrendered to His Majesty's Forces, and is now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Trade to and from Heligoland shall be confined to British Ships, navigated according to Law, except in Cases where His Majesty may be pleased by His special Licence otherwise to permit.

And for the more effectually preventing any Foreign Vessel carrying on any Trade, to or from the said Island, contrary to His Majesty's Will and Pleasure, as by this Order expressed, His Majesty is further pleased by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Foreign Vessel except as before excepted, shall enter into the Port, Harbour or Road lying between the Island of Heligoland, and Sandy Island, and the Shoals of the said Islands respectively, and commonly called or known by the Names of the North Haven, and the South Haven, under any Pretence whatever; and that no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize whatsoever, shall be in any Manner put on Shore in any Part of the said Island of Heligoland, from any such Foreign Vessel, or carried from the Shore of such Island to any such Foreign Vessel, or in any manner transhipped from any such Foreign Vessel, into any Vessel lying in the said Harbour, Port, or Road, or from any Vessel lying in the said Harbour, Port, or Road, into any such Foreign Vessel.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for enabling His Majesty to raise the Sum of Three Millions for the Service of Great Britain.

An Act to amend several Acts made in the Parliament of Ireland, for granting Life Annuities with Benefit of Survivorship.

An Act to rectify a Mistake in an Act, made in this Session of Parliament, for continuing and making perpetual several Duties of One Shilling and Six Pence on Offices and Employments.

An Act to continue, until the 25th Day of March 1810, an Act of this present Session of Parliament, to suspend the Importation of British or Irish-made Spirits into Great Britain or Ireland respectively.

An Act to continue, until the 25th Day of March 1811, an Act of the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for appointing Commissioners to inquire into the Public Expenditure, and the Conduct of the Public Business in the Military Departments therein mentioned.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, to provide for the Defence of the Realm, with respect to the Pur-

chase of Lands and Hereditaments for the Public Service.

An Act for better regulating the Office of Agent General for Volunteers and Local Militia.

An Act to amend the several Acts for securing the Collection of the Duties on Auctions in Ireland.

An Act to amend an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, for making Provision for the building and rebuilding of Churches, Chapels, and Glebe Houses in Ireland.

An Act to amend the several Acts, for the regulating and securing the Collection of the Duties on Spirits distilled in Ireland, and for the regulating the Sale of such Liquors by Retail.

*Copy of a Letter from Captain Baker, of His Majesty's Ship the Tartar, to Rear-Admiral Sir Richard G. Keates, and transmitted by Sir James Saumarez to the Honourable William Wellesley Pole.*

*His Majesty's Ship Tartar,*  
June 2, 1809.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that on the 15th of May 1809, I chased on Shore near Felixberg, on the Coast of Courland, a Danish Sloop Privateer, of Four Guns, Two of them Twelve-Pounders, on Slides, and Two Long Four-Pounders; the Crew, Twenty-four in Number, landing with their Muskets, and being joined by some of the Country People, posted themselves behind the Sand-Hills, near the Beach.—The Vessel appearing calculated to do much Mischief to the Trade, I sent the Boats of this Ship, under the Command of Lieutenants Sykes and Parker, with Orders either to bring her off or to destroy her, the former of which they effected with considerable Address and Activity, and without Loss, very soon getting the Vessel's Guns to bear upon the Beach.

Before the Danes abandoned her they placed a lighted Candle in a Twelve-Pounder Cartridge of Gunpowder, in the Magazine, where there was some Hundred Weight beside, which was happily discovered by one of the Boat's Crew, who immediately grasped it in his Hand, and extinguished it, when it had burned down within Half an Inch of the Powder; another Minute would in all Probability have been the Destruction of every Man on board and alongside the Vessel;—a dishonourable Mode of Warfare necessary to be known, to be properly guarded against.
