The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-third Day of November laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, o. carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatloever, (except the Master General of the Ord-nance for His Majelty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Aminunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majelty to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the "Law for empowering His Majelty to prohibit "the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelty to reftrain the carrying Coastwife of " Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition :"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His

WHEREAS the Island of Heligoland fur-rendered to His Majelty's Forces, and is now in His Majelty's Posseful films, His Majelty is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Trade to and from Heligoland (hall be confined to British Ships, navigated according to Law, except in Cales where His Majefty may be pleafed by His special Licence otherwife to permit.

And for the more effectually preventing any Foreign Vefiel carrying on any Trade, to or from the faid Ifland, contrary to His Majefty's Will and Pleafure, as by this Order expressed, His Majefty is further pleafed by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Foreign Veffel except as before excepted, fhall enter into the Port, Harbour or Road lying between the Island of Heligolaud, and Sandy Island, and the Shoals of the faid Islands respectively, and commonly called or known by the Names of the North Haven, and the South Haven, under any Pretence whatever; and that no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize whatsoever, shall be in any Mauner put on Shore in any Part of the faid Island of Heligoland, from any luch Foreign Vessel, or carried from the Shore of fuch Ifland to any fuch Foreign Veffel, or in any manner transhipped from any fuch Foreign Veffel, into any Veffel lying in the faid Harbour, Port, or Road, or from any Veffel lying in the faid Harbour, Port, or Road, into any fuch Foreign Veffel.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, His Majefty'-Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commifs fioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the neceffary Measures herein as to them may respectively appertain. 

REGULATIONS for preparing and drawing the laft Lottery authorized by Att 48 Geo. 3. Cap. 139.

WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Forty-VV eighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, Cap. 139, intituled "An Act for granting to His Majetty a Sum of Money to be raifed by Lotteries," certain Lotteries have been drawn, but One Lottery of Twenty Thouland Tickets remains to be drawn under the faid recited Act; and whereas by an Act, paffed in this Selfion of Parliament, for granting to His Majefty a certain Sum of Money to be raifed by Lotteries, it is, amongit other Things, recited, that it was expedient that the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury should be enabled to provide that the Lottery fo remaining to be drawn under the first recited A& fhould be drawn in One Day, and the Commissioners of the Trea-fury, or any Three or more of them, are therefore by the faid last recited AA authorised to direct, that the fame should be prepared, fold, and drawn under fuch Rules and Regulations as should be necessary for that Purpole.

Now, we being Three of the Lords Commiffioners of the Treafury, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in us by the faid laft recited Act, and in order that the Lottery remaining to be drawn under the faid first recited Act may be drawn in One Day, do direct, that the Managers and Directors appointed under the faid first recited Act for preparing and delivering out Tickets, or the major Part of fuch of them as shall be prefent at any Meeting held for the Purpofe, shall for the faid Lottery caufe a proper Number of Books to be prepared,



and divided into Four Classes, which shall be distinguifhed one from the other by the Letters A B C D being marked respectively on all the Books belonging to each Clafs, fo that all the Books belonging to one Clafs shall be marked A, and all the Books belonging to another Clafs shall be marked B, and fo in like Manner with Refpect to the other Books, and every Leaf in each of fuch Books shall be di-vided and diftinguished into Three Columns, and upon the innermost of the faid Three Columns in each Class of the faid Books, there shall be printed for the faid Lottery Five Thousand Tickets, to be numbered 1, 2, 3, and fo onwards in arithmetical Progreffion where the common Excels is to be One until they rife to the Number of 5000, and each Ticket shall be marked with the fame Letter as is marked upon the Book in which fuch Ticket is printed, and upon the middle Column in each of the faid Books shall be printed the like Number of Tickets, of the fame Breadth and Form, and numbered and lettered in the like Manner with the Tickets in the innermolt Column of the fame Book ; and in the extreme Column of each of fuch Books, there shall be printed a Third Rank or Series of Tickets, of the fame Number and Letter with those of the other Two Columns in the fame Book, which laft mentioned Tickets shall feverally be of an oblong Figure, and the Tickets in each of the faid Books shall be joined with oblique Lines, Flourishes, and Devices, in such Manner as the faid Managers and Directors, or the major Part of them prefent, shall think molt fafe and convenient; and every Ticket in the third or extreme Column of each of fuch Books, shall have written or printed thereupon, be-fides the Number of fuch Ticket, Words, Letters, or Figures to the following Effect :--- No. 1. Third Lottery 1808. The Bearer of this Ticket will be entitled to fuch Benefit as shall belong thereto in the faid Lottery to be drawn in purfuance of the Act paffed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign. Α.

And the Books shall be examined and delivered to the Cashiers of the Bank of England, and the Tickets of the extreme Columns shall be fold and cut off, and the Books delivered back to the faid Managers and Directors; and all other Proceedings in Respect of the faid Lottery shall be had in the Manner and under the Regulations prescribed in the faid first recited Act, except where the same are hereby altered.

And that the faid Managers and Directors, or the major Part of them which shall be prefent at a Meeting as aforefaid, shall cause all the Five Thoufaud Tickets in the middle Columns in the refpective Books marked A, to be carefully rolled up and made fast with Thread or Silk; and the faid Managers and Directors, or the major Part of them as aforefaid, shall in their Presence, and in the Prefence of any fuch Contributors or Adventurers as may be there, caufe all the faid Tickets which are to be rolled up and made fast as aforefaid, to be cut off indentwife through the faid oblique Lines, Flourishes, or Devices, into a Box to be prepared for that Purpole, and to be marked with the Letter A, which is prefently to be put into another flrong Box, and to be locked with Seven different Locks, and Keys to be kept by as many of the faid Managers and Directors, and fealed with their Scals, or the Seals of fome of them, until the faid Tickets are to be drawn; and the Tickets in the first or innermost Columus of the faid Books marked A, and the Tickets contained in the innermost and middle Columns of the feveral Books marked B C and D respectively, shall remain still in the Books for difcovering any Mistake or Fraud, if any should happen to be committed contrary to the true Meaning of this Act.
