PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth Day of December, One thousand eight hundred Day of December, One thouland eight hundred and eight, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Mast, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this King-dom that the faid Prohibition should be continued dom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majelly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons wholoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of July next, prefnme to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Mass, Yards, Bowsfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Cauvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpen-tine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bow-sprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majelly or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, initialed "An "Act to enable His Majesty to reltrain the Expor-" tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and " Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation " or Order in Council:" But it is neverthelefs His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majelty, or I upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 21ft employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy ; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vesfel during the Couffe of her intcaded Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plan-tations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coalt of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpole of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weit Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factorics in the Ea.1 Indies. the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-miffioners of His Majelly's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commillioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, neverthelefs, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported,
