being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the Britifh Plantawions in the Welt Iudies, or to any of His Majefty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter fhall firt verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Ule of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnifbed with any Supply of the faid Articles during the fame Seafon: and provided allo that the Exportation of the faid Articles hall, in no Cale, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Seafon: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.

REGUL 1 TIONS for preparing and drawing the laf Lottery authorifed by $A$ AI 48 Geo. 3. Cap. 139. * JHereas by an Act, paffed in the Fortyeighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelly, Cap. 139, intituled "An Act for granting to His Majelty a Sum of Money to be raifed by Lotteries," certain Lotteries have been drawn, but One Lottery of 'rwenty Thoufand Tickets remains to be drawn under the faid recited AC: and whereas by an Act, paffed in this Seffion of Parliament, for granting to His Majefty a certain Sum of Money to be raifed by Lotteries, it is, amongit other Things, recited, that it was expedient that the Lords Commiffioners of the Treafury fhould be enabled to provide that the Lottery fo remaining to be drawn under the firlt recited Act fhould be drawn in One Day, and the Commiffioners of the Treafury, or any Three or more of them, are therefore by the faid laft recited Ast authorifed to direct, that the fame fhould be prepared, fold, and drawn under fuch Rules and Regulations as fhould be neceffary for that Purpole.

Now, we being Three of the Lords Commirfioners of the Treafury, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in us by the faid laft recited Aç, and in order that the Lottery remaining to be drawn under the faid firt recited AA may bedrawn in One Day, do direct, that the Managers and Directors appointed under the faid firt recited Act for preparing and delivering out Tickets, or the major Part of fuch of them as fhall be prefent at any Meeting held for the Purpofe: fhall for the faid Lottery caufe a proper Number of Books to be prepared, and divided into Four Claffes, which fhall be dittinguifhed one from the other by the Letters A B C D being marked refpectively on all the Books belonging to cach Clafs, fo that all the Books belonging to one Clafs hall be marked $A$, and all the Books
belonging in ancitier Clafs flatl be marked $B$. and fo in like Pianner with kefpect to the other Books. and cvery Leaf in each of fuch Books hatl be divided and dillinguifaed into Three Columns, and upon the innermoft of the faid Three Columns in each Clafs of the faid Books, there fhall be printed for the faid Lottery Five 'Fhoufand Tickets, to be numbered $1,2,3$, and fo onwards in arithmetical Progreftion where the common Excefs is to be Une until they rifc to the Number of 5000 , and each Ticket thall be marked with the fame Letter as is marked upon the Book in which fuch Ticket is printed, and upon the middle Column in each of the faid Books flall be printed the like Number of Tickets, of the fame Breadth and Form, and numbered and lettered in the like Manner with the Tickets in the iunermolt Colunn of the fame Book: and in the extreme Column of each of fuch Books, thene thall be printed a Third Rank or Series of Tickets, of the fame Number and Letter with thofe of the other Two Columns in the fame Book, which latt mentioned Tickets fhall feverally be of an oblong Figure, and the Tickets in each of the faid Books Thall be juined with oblique Lines, Flourifhes, and Devices, in fuch Manner as the faid Managers and Directors, or the majur Part of them prefent, fhall think moll fafe and convenient; and every Ticket in the third or extreme Column of each of fuch Books, fhall have writter or printed thereupon, befides the Number of fuch Ticket, Words, Lerters, or Figures to the following Effect:-No. I. Third Lottery 8808 . The Bearer of this Ticket will be entitled to fuch Benefit as flall belong thereto in the faid Lottery to be drawn in purfuance of the ACt paffed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majefty's Reign.

And the Books fhall be examined and delivered to the Cafliers of the Bank of England, and the Tickets of the extreme Columns hall be fold and cut off, and the Books delivered back to the faid Managers and Directors; and all other Proceedings in Refpect of the faid Lottery flall be had in the Manner and under the Regulations prefcribed in the faid tirlt recited Act, except where the fame are hereby altered.

And that the faid Managers and Directors, or the major Part of them which flall be prefent at a Meeting as afurefaid, fhall caufe all the Five Thouo fand lickets in the middle Columns in the reipective Books marked A, to be carefully rolled up and made falt with Thread or Silk; and the faid Managers and Directors; or the major Part of them as aforefaid, fhall in their Prefence, and in the Prefence of any fuch Contributors or Adventurers as may be there, caufe all the faid Tickets which are to be rolled up and made falt as aforefaid, to be cut off indentwife through the faid oblique Lines, Flourifhes, or Devices, into a Box to be prepared for that Purpofe, and to be marked with the Letter A, which is prefencly to be put into another ttrong Box, and to be locked with Seven different Locks, and Keys in be kept by as many of the faid Mao nagers and Directors, and fealed with their Seals, or the Seals of fome of them, until the faid Tickets are to be drawn; and the Tickets in the furt or innermoft Columns of the faid Books marked $A$, and the Tickets contained in the innermoft and middle Columns of the feveral Books marked BC and D refpectively, fhall remain atill in the Books for dif:
