AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 21st of June 1809,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eight, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Maiestry's Service, and the Safety of this King-His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingtlom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majetty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of July next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp. Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An 46 Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-4 tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council: But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majeky's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Wellels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or

employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnauce, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vesfel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settle-ments on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purpose of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonics and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, (except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-missioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commis-sioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Grease, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond

being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to ( any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majelty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the same Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the same Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord "Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respec-W. Fawkener. tively appertain.

## Admiralty-Office, July 4, 1809.

Copies of Two Letter's from Captain M. Kiniey, of His Majesty's Ship the Lively, to the Honourable William . Wellefley Pole.

SIR, Lively, Vigo, June 7, 1809.

E pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, Yesterday Evening, an Express arrived from a Spanish Officer at San Payo to Commodore Don Juan Carranfas, that the Conde de Norona was retiring with his Division of the Galician Army from Pontevedra to that Place, and defiring Boats might be there to convey the Troops across the River, (the Bridge having been broken down on the 7th of May,) Commodore Don J. Carranfas requesting Assistance, Captain Winter with the Cadmus who had been obliged to put back from Stress of Weather) immediately sailed up the River with the Portuguese Schooner Curiosa, under my Orders from the Honourable Vice Admiral Berkeley, the Tigre Spanish Schooner of War, and as many Boats and Veilels as could possibly be collected.

This retrograde Movement caused me much anxiety; and I very early this Morning went up in the Barge to San Payo, where I found Brigadier-General Carrera strongly posted on the South Side of the Bridge (the Conde de Norona being at Redondela); and in my Interview with him, I learnt that the Enemy after the Brigadier-General had taken Santiago, united his Forces from Lugo to thole of Corunna, amounting to Eight Thousand Men, Two Thousand Five Hundred Cavalry, with feveral Field-Pieces and some Twelve-Pounders.

' This Force being very much superior to the Brigadier's, he retreated to Caldas and Pontevedra, where the Conde de Norona joined. From the ex-cessive and continued heavy Rains we have had of late, much of the Ammunition was unavoidably damaged, and Pontevedra being too distant to receive any more when attacked, the falling back on fuch a liveng Polition was well conceived and most ably executed. On a Height above the Bridge they had a Battery of Two Eighteen Pounders, and

young Men without Arms, One Hundred and Twenty Horfe, Nine Field Pieces, acting under the immediate Direction of the Brigadier-General.

At Nine the Enemy appeared on the other Side in great Force, and although the Galician Troops had undergone much Fatigue, and fuffered greatly from the Inclemency of the Weather, to which they had been constantly exposed, yet, on the Approach of the Enemy nothing could exceed the Animation and Spirit of the Soldiers, all was Alacrity and Confidence, and I left the Brigader-General, and was faluted by the Enemy from their Field Pieces, but without hurting us, although nearly within Musket-Shot; at Half-past Nine they opened their Fire on the Spaniards, which was most spiritedly returned and their Field Artillery was moved with great Alacrity and well ferved.

On my Return on board I landed my Marines and Twenty-five Seamen at the Castle (having taken them on board some Days past); and Lieutenant-Colonel Carroll, in the most zeatous and handsome Manner, offered his Services to affilt Captain Crawford in Defence of the Caltle. Sixty Soldiers, whom he brought from Gijon with him, (Part of our Army,) at his earneit Request were landed, and I supplied them with Arms; and every Thing was put in the beil possible Order of Defence by Commodore Don Juan Carranfas, Don Bernado Gonçalez the Governor, and Captain Crawford, of His Majesty's Ship Venus.

Lively, Vigo. June 12, 1809. I CONCLUDED my Letter of the 7th Instant, which I did myself the Honour of writing to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the Enemy had began an Attack at Half-past Nine that Morning on the Spanish Troops under the Command of Brigadier-General Carrera, on the South Side of the Bridge of St. Payo.

I have to request you will be pleased to make known to their Lordships, that the Enemy, having taken Post on the North Side of the Bridge, a Pistol-shot across, in Houses, and in a Wood a little below it, kept up his Attack, supported with Field Artillery and Three Twelve-Pounders, with great Vivacity during the whole of that Day (the 7th), which was fullained by the Galician Army with

great Coolness and Bravery.

During the Night of the 7th, the Enemy erected a Battery. Commodore Don Juan Carransas sent up Three Gun-Boats, One of which Captain Wynter manned, under the Charge of Lieutenant Jefferson, his First Lieutenant. At Daylight in the Morning of the 8th. the Enemy opened his Fire, both on the Galician Troops and the Boats; the latter of which, from the Tide being up, got near, and destroyed the Enemy's Batteries. At the Fall of the Tide the Eveny made Two desperate At-tempts to cross below the Bridge with his Cavalry and Infantry, but the great Courage and Spirit difplayed by our Friends repulsed them with great Slaughter. A Body of them went higher up the River to the Bridge to Sottomayor, and that active and brave Officer Don Pablo Murillo was detached with a Division to oppose them, and the Enemy, this Army was increased to between Six and Seven with a Division to oppose them, and the Enemy, Thousand Men armed, and Three Thousand fine after persevering for an Hour and an Half, were

obliged to give way to the superior Gallantry of the Spaniards, and retreated to San Payo, where another Attack, during a thick Fog, was again made by the Enemy, who, as in the former ones, was driven back, and Marshal Neys who commanded the French Troops, confishing of Eight Thousand Men, Two Thousand Five Hundred Cavalry, with Field Artifery and Two Twelve-Pounders, experienced a Defeat from a new raifed Army confifting or Six Thousand Armed Men, and Three Thoufand without Arms, and some small Field Artillery, with Two Lighteen-Pounders, and in the Night the retreated, leaving some of his Wounded. The Enemy burnt many of their Dead, and in one Pit has been discovered Thirty baried; his Loss must have been great. The Lois on the Side of the Spaniards has been trifling, only One Hundred and Ten killed and rwounded. Captain Wynter, who was fome Time at the Camp, and who had a narrow Escape, a Grape Shot having grazed his Hat, described to me that such was the Animation of the Spanish Troops, that it was with Difficulty they were reflrained by their \*Officers from pushing across.

Thus, Sir, the Spirit and good Conduct of this Division of the Spanish Galician Army who, though without almost every Part of Clothing, and exposed to heavy Rains without Shelter, had shewn to their own Nation, and to all Europe, that they are in-· spired with Ardour for the Delivery of their Country from a cruel Ulurper, which alone a brave and loyal People can feel; and the Merit of their Commanders bears so conspicuous a Part, as their Lordships must appreciate much better than I could take the Liberty of expressing of Officers superior in Rank to myfelf. And it is but just to say, that the Officers employed in the Gun-Boats, executed well the Instructions they received from Don Juan Carranlas, whose unwearied Aftention to give every Aid and Affistance to the Army with the most active Promptitude excited Admiration.

Lieutenant Toledo, commanding the Tigre Spamish Schooner of War who was up the River to give Succour, was most active, and Lieutenant Alves, commanding the Portuguese Schooner Curioza, was alert and zealous to support the Cause; and you will also be pleased to express to their Lordships the Happinels I feel in being enabled to inform them that Captain Wynter and the British Officers and Men felt all that Ardour to affift real Friends which is inherent in their Character.
