A^T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 21ft of June 1809,

PRESENT,

The KING's Moit Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eight, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Maieffre's Service, and the Safety of this King-His Majelty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingtlom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majelty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of July next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp. Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An 4 Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-4 tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and "Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation "or Order in Council-" But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majerty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or

employed or freighted by His Majelty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commillioners of His Majelty's Navy ; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuck Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Use of such Ship or Vesfel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid fe-veral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plan-tations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settle-ments on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Ex-portation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-pole of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonics and Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Ma-jefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Illand of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, (except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-miffioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered outwards, and for the Purpoles spe-cified, and none other; and such Bond shail not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commif-fioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majeily's Pleasure, neverthelefs, that the following Articlus, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond
