Cosy of a Letter from Vice Admiral Sir James Saumarez, Bart. and K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Baltic, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board the Victory, of Hango Head, 29th June 1809.

SIR.

HEREWITH inclose the Copy of a Letter transmitted to me by Captain Barrett, of His Majelty's Ship Minotaur, which he had received Ballaft.

from Captain Samuel Warren, of the Bellerophon, acquainting him of an Attack made by the Boats of that Ship, under the Orders of Lieutenant Pilch, on a Battery upon one of the Illands near Hango Head which, after an obstinate Resistance, was car, ried in a very gallant Manner by the Party under Lieutenant Pilch's Orders, who foiked the Guns (Four Twenty-four Pounders) and deftroyed the Magazine, which you will pleafe to lay before the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty.

## I am, &c. JAS. SAUMAREZ. (Signed) Bellerophon, off Dageroft,

SIR, June 20, 1809. PURSUANT to your Signal to me of Yester-

day, I proceeded in His Majetty's Ship under my Command of Hango; when at Sunfet I discovered a Lugger (apparently armed) and Two other Veffels at Anchor within the Islands; deeming it of Importance to get hold of them, I anchored and detached the Boats under the Orders of Lieutenant Filch; and have to acquaint you, that they had gained complete Poffefiion of the Veffels, which being found were of no Confequence, and under Cover of Four strong Batteries, (not before ob-ferved,) supported by several Gun-Boats, were abandoned. It was then judged necessary, to prevent Lofs in returning, to dafh at the neareft Battery, mounting Four Twenty-four Pounders, (and by a Mufter-Roll found, garrifoned with One Hundred and Three Men,) which, after an obstinate Refistance, was carried in the most gallant Manner, the Ruffians retreating to Boats on the other Side the Island. The Guns were fpiked, and Magazine destroyed.

Lieutenant Pilch reports to me the very able Affistance he received from Lieutenauts Sheridan and Bentham, Lieutenant Carrington, Royal Marines, and Mr. Mart, Carpenter (Volunteers); and that more cool Bravery could not have been displayed than by the Officers and Men employed on this Service; and, confidering the Refiftance met with, and heavy Fire of Grape-Shot from Batteries and Gun-Boats in the Retreat, the Lofs is comparatively Imall, being Five wounded, whofe Names are in the Margin

It is the Opinion of the Officers the Lofs of the Enemy in killed and wounded was confiderable.
