Copy of a Letter from Captain Durban of His Majesty's Ship the Renown, addressed to Vice-Admiral Lord Collingwood, and transmitted by his Lordship to the Honourable W. W. Pole.

His Majesty's Ship Renown, off Toulon,

MY LORD, May 4, 1809.

I HAVE the Honour to inform your Lordship, that I this Morning captured off Marfeilles, the French National Armed Vessel; La Champenoise, commanded by Monsieur Chautard, Ensigne de Vaisseau, pierced for Twelve Guns, but mounting only Six, with a Crew of Thirty-one Seamen and Fifty-two Sick and Wounded Soldiers from Barcelona, from which Port she sailed Three Days ago.
