His Majesty's Ship Renown, off Toulon,
My Lord, May 4, 1809.

HAVE the Honour to inform your Lordship,
that I this Morning captured off Marseilles, the
French National Armed Vessel; La Champenoise,
commanded by Monsieur Chautard, Ensigne de
Vaisseau, pierced for Twelve Guns, but mounting
only Six, with a Crew of Thirty-one Seamen and
Fifty-two Sick and Wounded Soldiers from Barcelona, from which Port she failed Three Days ago.
